Ministry, Missions, Leaders, Prayer, & Thanks

October is one of my favorite months of the year. It's beautiful on Cape Cod and in New England with the lovely foliage and the slanting sunlight of shortening days. One of the things about living in the northeastern part of our nation is we experience four seasons and are reminded of the cyclical nature of the rhythms of life that God has woven into creation. There are some things that happen annually and there are some things that occur rarely or occasionally. This is also seen in the life of our church.

On **October 3 at 3:00 pm**, we'll celebrate **Pastor Barbara Burrill's ordination into the Christian ministry in the ABCUSA**. Barbara

is the third person to be ordained into Christian ministry at BBC this century joining The Rev. Kevin Saxton (2003) and The Rev. Patti Ricotta (2014). We look forward to sharing with Barbara in this significant moment in her life and spiritual journey. Congratulations, Barbara!

On **October 4**, we will celebrate **World Communion Sunday** and receive the **World Mission Offering** to support our ABCUSA International Missionaries and our partners around the world. This is a Sunday when we especially remember that we're part of the global family of God. We have not observed communion in our sanctuary since February because of COVID-19 concerns. However, **we will**

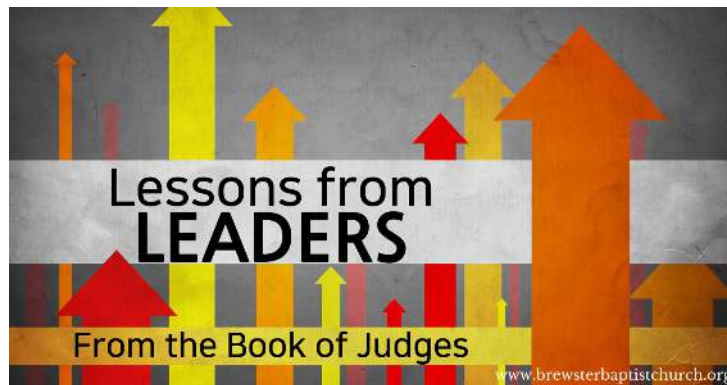

some awful things that take place in it. Yet, even in the most trying circumstances, God calls on leaders and people of faith to respond appropriately. We will see what we can learn from the lives described in *Judges* like Deborah, Samson, Gideon, and Abimelech.

For seven months—from March through September—I have selected and prepared a monthly schedule of daily Bible readings as well as choosing a verse or verses as the focus of each day on which I did a video reflection. I'm grateful that some of you have shared that journey with me either reading the passages and/or watching the videos on the church website or Facebook page. I hope it has helped to grow your faith and your love for God and people. Reading the Bible regularly is important for our relationship with God and our faith.

A second spiritual habit or discipline we want to grow in is **prayer**. So in October, instead of having a daily Bible reading and verse of the day, I will be sharing a **Prayer of the Day**. My intention is to use prayers from the Bible as well as prayers from throughout Christian history from a range of people. Some of the prayers will be brief, others will be longer. Some of the language will reflect a different time or culture. I'm going to share many different types of prayers to hopefully enlarge your understanding of the many ways we can pray to and with God. I know many people feel like beginners when it comes to prayer and

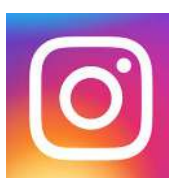
wouldn't be comfortable if asked to pray in front of a small group or for the whole congregation. If that describes you, I invite you to join me in growing in your knowledge and comfort with prayer by praying daily with me in the month of October. It isn't possible to include all the prayers in *The Beacon* so you will have to "tune in" to our website, church app or social media pages to hear them. **Children's Worship starts
Sunday, October 4 at the 9:30am service only**

Prior to Each Sunday Morning

Families should pre-register each week (online or call the church) for the Worship Service. Kindly register as early in the week as possible once you know that you plan to attend.

Sunday Morning Arrival

Families should check in on Sunday morning at the Computer Check-In Station.

A staff person will enter all check-ins to minimize the spread of germs.

Hand sanitizer is available throughout the building.

Families should start Worship together in the Sanctuary (or Fellowship Hall).

All children age 5+ must wear a mask in the building.

What to Expect at Children's Worship

Children will be dismissed from the Sanctuary prior to the sermon.

The children will go upstairs to the Chapel where they will be seated socially distanced.

We will resume worship using our curriculum for "The Gospel Project."

There will be a time for prayer, worship, a story, an offering, and missions.

October is box collecting for the World Mission Offering.

Dismissal Procedure

Parents should pick up children in Community Hall. Please come immediately after the service. We will let parents in one at a time to Community Hall to maintain social distancing. Parents should pick up their child (children) and exit through the back door. The sidewalk will bring you out by the playground. The playground will be open but parents must supervise.

Additional Information

We need volunteers to assist with children during worship. Please speak with Pastor Barbara if you can assist.

There is still no Nursery at this time but the Nursery rooms are open for parents to use with infants and toddlers. Rooms will be sanitized in between each service if the room is used.

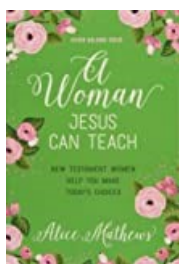

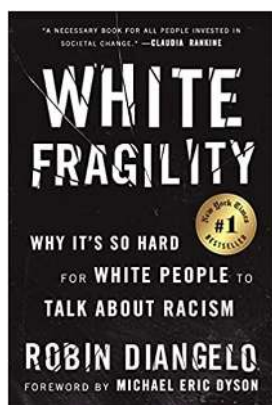

CARING MINISTRIES

Brewster Council on Aging (COA) Offers Transportation Assistance & Annual Flu Clinic

While the Council on Aging remains closed, they are excited to reintroduce limited **medical transportation** options. Transportation will be offered on Mondays & Wednesdays to bring 1 Brewster senior per day (no further than Hyannis) to a doctor's appointment, for a wellness checkup, treatment, or blood work. Contact the COA at least 4 business days prior to the upcoming appointment; schedule appointments between 9 am and 2pm on Mondays & Wednesdays. On Tuesdays & Thursdays, the COA will be delivering groceries, prescriptions, medical equipment, masks, and other essential needs to Brewster seniors. All safety precautions, such as social distancing, hygiene protocol and cleaning/disinfecting, will be strictly enforced.

The annual **Brewster Town Flu Clinic** will be held Thursday, October 22nd from 1–4 pm in Our Lady of the Cape Parish parking lot. Please call the Brewster COA at 508-896-2737 for more information.

Get a Flu Shot now! The CDC recommends that **ALL** people *over the age of* 6 months get an annual flu shot. The Flu shot, if given a few weeks before the Flu hits, will help decrease the duration and intensity of the Flu if you do get it.

Wear A Mask or Face Covering. Experts agree that this is the ONE MOST IMPORTANT thing that you can do to keep yourself and those around you healthy!

Avoid close contact. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, avoid close contact with others to protect them from getting sick too.

Stay home when you are sick. If possible, stay home from work, school, day care, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness.

Cover your mouth and nose. Use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing, then drop it in the trash. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve rather than your hands.

Wash your hands often. Washing your hands with soap & water often will help protect you from germs. Use soap & water or an alcohol-based hand rub. Alcohol-based hand sanitizers are great in an emergency but do not serve as a replacement for old-fashioned handwashing.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Sickness often spreads when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches their eyes, nose or mouth.

Other ways to stay healthy: Get plenty of sleep, eat nutritious foods, exercise regularly, drink plenty of fluids, manage your stress level, clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.

Other Vaccines to Consider

Pneumonia. For adults age 65 and older, there are two different pneumonia vaccines recommended to stay healthy. These two vaccines work together to provide better protection.

Shingles. There is a new shingles vaccine recommended for adults age 50 and older that is more than 90% effective at preventing this painful skin rash.

CARING MINISTRIES

If you or a family member show symptoms resembling COVID-19 or the Flu, call your doctor within the first 48–72 hours!

If your doctor diagnoses Flu ask about starting Tamiflu or Xofluza. They both can decrease the duration and severity of the Flu as well as prevent complications like pneumonia. Push fluids like tea, chicken broth or popsicles, even if you do not have an appetite. This will replace electrolytes and prevent dehydration caused by the fever. Check your temperature. Call your doctor or dial 911, right away, if you aren't improving or have any signs of complications like disorientation, chest pain, difficulty breathing or swallowing. These can be signs of dehydration, bronchitis or pneumonia. Most at risk are the elderly, children and those with chronic conditions like cancer or immune suppression. The Flu usually lasts about a week. Consider going back to work or school when you feel strong and have been fever free for at least 24 hours.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

2020 has been an unusual year in all walks of life. I am reminded of the phrases we often say, "God is Good, ALL the Time." God has been so good to BBC through this pandemic. It has been the faithful members of BBC that continue to give generously to BBC that has made this such a remarkable year. Praise God. Thank you for your generous support over the past nine months.

The following numbers represent figures through September 21, 2020 of our current budget year.

Our overall budget through September 21 is \$820,627.

Currently, we have taken in \$820,196.

This is an increase of close to 12% over last year at this time. This is simply unbelievable given all that is happening in 2020 with regards to the pandemic.

Projected expenses through September 21 are \$820,627.

Currently, we have spent \$804,373.99.

This includes an upgrade to the audio/visual and lighting equipment. Additionally, BBC purchased three cameras for livestreaming our services.

BBC has always taken special offerings to help people in need. This has always been one of our strengths. In 2020, BBC has raised more than \$47,731. This is an 8% increase over the previous year. The Deacon Assistance Fund has taken in more than \$21,295 and Caring Cupboard more than \$1,325. The final tally for OGHHS offering was more than \$13,630.

FUNDS AVAILABLE: New Brewster Rental Assistance Program

Short-term assistance for Brewster renters
with challenges paying their rent during COVID-19

AND

On-going monthly rental assistance to help make
year-round rentals affordable for low to moderate income residents.

This new **Brewster Rental Assistance Program**, created by the Brewster Affordable Housing Trust, with Town Community Preservation funds, has resources available for both year round affordability and emergency COVID-19 assistance. Housing Assistance Corporation (HAC) is administering the program which also has a case management component.

Requirements include, but are not limited to:

- Income limits. Up to 80 or 100% Area Median Income (AMI) depending on program.
- Brewster resident or employee or child in public elementary schools.
- Rental unit in Brewster.
- Lease payments made directly to landlord.
