had long term implications for God's future.

I hope you will enjoy being part of our moving through the Bible, whether you're seeking to read the book of the week, or reading the key chapter or two each day, or watching the daily video devotional and pondering the verse of the day. I pray that spending more time in God's Word will help you grow in wisdom and understanding and enable you to reflect God's loving and gracious Spirit more fully in your daily life.

As I write this article I'm sitting in the East Street Café at Mass General Hospital waiting for my neighbor to receive an urgent cancer treatment and exam. Masks are required everywhere, and they distribute their own as you enter the building. It is a reminder of life everywhere a few short months ago.

It is easy to forget as we move out of the pandemic of the many restrictions we've endured, but I'm reminded each week of the extremely loyal volunteers that enable the broadcast of our services. Throughout the year plus that COVID-19 kept us isolated from each other physically, these volunteers initially recorded services for the website, then moved to live streaming one service and now facilitate three services, two of which are streamed live. In addition to Sunday morning, there are rehearsals on Wednesday night and review of the services on Monday. It is a commitment they have taken on throughout the pandemic, and we are truly blessed to have them. We are losing two of our key volunteers: Rachel Pranga who will head to the University of Massachusetts Amherst, and Greg Scalise who will start Gordon Conwell Seminary at the end of August. They will be sorely missed. Scheduling everything is a challenge, but we hope to have more trained volunteers in the next several weeks. Please pray for all those who help to get the WORD out. If you are having difficulty or experience a degradation in service viewing, please feel free to let me know directly (rings3@gmail.com). We are always looking to improve, but please be aware that we can't control the buffering on the internet or the quality of the speakers on phones or laptops; we will, however, adjust whatever we can within our power to enhance your viewing experience. If you'd like to become part of the team, we meet each Wednesday at 5:30 to prepare for the upcoming Sunday, and we also train people on the equipment.

The review of the Van Latham recommendations continues by both the AC and MC. The home which was generously bequeathed to the church by Flo Roberts has been sold, and as soon as the Probate Court catches up with their backlog, we expect to clear all debts and close things out.

You will see some construction around the church, and some has already begun. On the interior, volunteers led by the Kautz family are giving a much-needed facelift to the area near the Chapel traditionally used as by the student ministry of the church. The new cool colors will augment some new technology and enhance the students' experience who will utilize the new space on a regular basis. But wait, due to the clever design, it will be an area where many groups can meet in comfort. Furniture and storage from IKEA will make it a more comfortable and inviting area for many groups in the church. In addition, Geoff, Chuck and Tom have renovated the restrooms behind the sanctuary. Thank you to all contributing to these efforts!

On the outside of the church in the Fall, we will see the roof replaced in some areas and repairs in others. The estimate on the timeframe is two weeks, but we'll keep you informed when it occurs and what, if any, changes that will mean to the traffic pattern in the parking lot during construction. One thing is for sure: whether you are using a facility or not, maintenance is always needed.



Weekly Bible Reading for Through the Bible Series

For each day there is listed the chapters you need to read through the book in one week if you wish to read the whole Bible during the series. Financial Update

The Finance Team would like to thank everyone for their generous support of Brewster Baptist Church. The continual financial support has been astonishing despite the COVID-19 Pandemic. Yet, people continue to give to our general fund, Deacon Assistance Fund, and special offerings. Praise God!

Now we are almost through the first seven months of our budget calendar. Our overall budget for the first seven months has projected expenses of \$701,750. Currently, we have taken in over \$706,029 towards our general budget. Our budget is in good shape — which is unbelievable during these times. Through July 22, BBC has only spent \$638,933.21 which is well below our projected budgeted expenses and leaves BBC in a very strong position for the second half of the year.

Special Offerings continue to be a strength at BBC. In 2021, BBC has taken in over \$42,552 for Special Offerings. Thank you to everyone who has supported One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) which has taken in over \$18,000 through July 25 and has surpassed our goal of \$7,500. These OGHS funds will go to help those impacted by both natural and human-made disasters around the world. The Deacon's Fund offering is accepted the first Sunday of the month. The **Deacon's Fund Offering** is gratefully accepted to assist those, both inside and out of BBC, with short-term or one-time emergency needs. Thank you very much for your generosity.

BBC Women's Book Discussion Goup


