THE WORDS OF THE PROPHETS

In worship for the first quarter of the year, we're hearing from the prophets of Judah and Israel who challenge God's people to get serious about their relationship with the Lord and to make decisions and commitments that reflect God's priorities of justice, love, and mercy for the poor and needy, the widow and the orphan, and strangers and homeless in their midst. We hear repeated refrains to repent and return to the Lord and not repeat the sins of their ancestors. Sadly, Judah and Israel are often guilty of idolatry, shallow faith, greed, corruption, immorality, lust for power, relying on military might, and political alliances rather than on the Lord. God repeatedly sends prophets to warn the people to change their ways before it's too late.

The concluding section of the Hebrew Bible is known as the Minor Prophets. They're called "minor" because they're much shorter in length than the prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel. However, the words God

spoke through

them are still powerful and important for our lives of faith. Jesus quoted several times not only from Isaiah but from Hosea reflecting how he was influenced and shaped by the words of the prophets.

The prophets we'll be hearing from this month include two of the shortest and least well known, Obadiah and Nahum, along with Jonah and Micah. **Obadiah** repeatedly uses the phrase, "you should not have" in describing the sinful behavior of the Edomites in not helping God's people in their time of distress, but in fact, exploiting their hardship. Obadiah speaks to the need for God's people to not stand aside but to be engaged in helping our neighbors.

Jonah is the most reluctant of all the prophets, in fact the word "prophet" doesn't appear in the book. Unlike his more courageous and faithful colleagues like Amos and Jeremiah, Jonah doesn't go to Nineveh as the Lord commands him, he tries to flee from the presence of the Lord. That never works out well. It's hard to flee from the God of the universe. Jonah's attempt to escape from God by sailing west instead of going east is a good reminder for us to pause and to think about the direction of our life.

Micah 6:8 is one of the best one verse summaries of the requirements of a person of faith in the whole Bible: "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord


require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

In Jonah, the whole city of Nineveh repents, fasts, and prays, and the Lord changes his mind and doesn't destroy the city. In **Nahum**, about 100 years later, the city of Nineveh is evil, wicked, and


unrepentant. One thing we learn from the prophets is that repentance, forgiveness, and second chances are possible for anyone. However, there also comes a time when, because God is good, God's judgment on evil comes. As *Nahum 1:3* declares, "The Lord is slow to anger but great in power, and the Lord will by no means clear the quilty."

I hope our journey through the prophets and their words of conviction and challenge will inspire you in your walk of faith to do what *Hosea 12:6* says, "But as for you, return to your God, hold fast to love and justice, and wait continually for your God."

Have you ever postponed doing something thinking you'll have time later? I do this frequently. Late last fall when I heard about the death of Colin Powell, I paused. I had been privileged to meet him at a dinner honoring my CEO, George Heilmeier (Bell Communications Research), where I received General Powell's memoirs as a gift. Being a Kindle reader and receiving a hardcover book in excess of 620 pages, the size of the book itself was indeed daunting. I began reading it the day after the news alert. I was hooked and carried that book everywhere, and although it covered many decades, as I got toward the conclusion, I had mixed feelings. The book had become a close friend that took me through the decades of my own life experience, and I didn't want it to end. I want to share with you an excerpt from the book that followed a story about a soldier who was asked if he was afraid on the eve of Desert Storm. He said "no" because his unit was a family and family takes care of one another. General Powell's reaction was:

"It is a metaphor for what we have to do as a nation. We have to start thinking of America as a family. We have to stop screeching at each other, stop hurting one another, and instead start caring for, sacrificing for, and sharing with one another. We have to stop constantly criticizing, which is the way of the malcontent, and instead get back to the can-do attitude that made America." We, as faithful servants of the Lord can be examples of Christian behavior—that beacon that draws people to the church wondering how they can be more like us.

I started thinking that every generation has challenges. Some are wars, economic failures and pandemics. I feel so incredibly blessed to be part of the Brewster Baptist family, and I see incredible generosity and talent among my brothers and sisters in Christ. I am encouraged that we can take care of one another and seek to move continuously forward regardless of the obstacles put in our way, remaining faithful to the Lord and his family of believers.

By the time this is published, you will, God willing, have been able to gather, learn and vote on the recommendations formulated first by a consultant, prayerfully considered, and presented by a collaborative team of members of the Ministry Council and Advisory Council recommending appropriate amendments to our governing documents. I hope you have had the opportunity to express your questions and concerns at an information session. Change is never simple or easy, but it is inevitable. A lot of the changes are geared to protect the church we love, and others to make it more efficient without sacrificing function.

If all goes as planned, my role will transition to the new leadership team, and I will help in that transition in any way that is required. I have had the privilege of working with an outstanding Advisory Council and know that you will continue to question, comment, and inquire after I leave. Please continue to do so, it is your church.

- 1. It ain't as bad as you think. It will look better in the morning.
- 2. Get mad, then get over it.
- 3. Avoid having your ego so close to your position that when your position falls, your ego goes with it.
- 4. It can be done!
- 5. Be careful what you choose. You may get it.
- 6. Don't let adverse facts stand in the way of a good decision.
- 7. You can't make someone else's choices. You shouldn't let someone else make yours.
- 8. Check small things.
- 9. Share credit.
- 10. Remain calm. Be kind.
- 11. Have a vision. Be demanding.
- 12. Don't take counsel of your fears or naysayers.
- 13. Perpetual optimism is a force multiplier.

FEBRUARY STUDENT MINISTRY UPDATE







Women's Bible Study

BBC's Women's Bible Study resumes on Tuesdays at 9:30 am or 6:30 pm in the conference room. You may also join the Bible Study on Zoom.


