The Urgency of Telling the Coming Generation about God's Goodness

The number of people in our nation who believe in God and heaven and who regularly attend worship or claim any religious affiliation has been dropping significantly for years.

According to Lifeway Research, there was a net loss of 1,500 Protestant churches in the USA in 2019, the last year such data was available, and that was before COVID-19 cut a swath across the religious landscape. The older a person is, the more likely he or she believes in God and is a

part of a faith community. As you move downward in age from those 80-100, 60-79, 40-59, 20 -39, with each younger group there are fewer people who describe themselves as having a belief in or a relationship with

God or being an active part of a community of faith.

While COVID-19 may have accelerated this decline, there is a broader, long-running trend of people moving away from religion in America. In 2017, Lifeway surveyed young adults aged between 18 and 22 who had attended church regularly for at least a year during high school. The firm found that seven out of 10 had stopped attending church regularly.

According to Scott McConnell, executive director at Lifeway Research, when asked why they left, one of the top answers was church members seem to be judgmental or hypocritical. This should be concerning to all of us.

Every believer has a responsibility to live in a way that pleases God and to seek to tell the story of God's love and goodness in history and in our own lives in a way that is inviting and authentic. This has always been important for God's people. *Psalm*

78:3-4 says this about the urgency of telling the coming generation about God's goodness, "things that we have heard and known, that our ancestors have told us. We will not hide them from their children; we will tell to the coming generation

the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done."

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The Finance Team would like to thank everyone for their generous support of Brewster Baptist Church. It is through your financial support that we can continue to move forward. Your stewardship offerings are used to pay staff, operate the building, minister to the church and community, and of course, Missions!

Now, we are almost through the first eight and half months of our budget calendar. The following numbers I'm sharing reflect income and expenses through September 15, 2023. Some things regarding finances are going very well, while others need some improvement in the last quarter of the year.

The Good – BBC Special Offerings and designated Missions giving is outstanding! Earlier this year, BBC took in over \$63,000 for the Africa House Renovation Project. Our missionaries Bill & Ann Clemmer will be using the money to help get children off the streets and provide them with housing and education, and teaching them more about Jesus. The Clemmers are ministering to over 800 children. BBC far exceeded our goal of \$20,000. Praise God for this generosity by our people at BBC.

Brewster Baptist Church has received over \$31,000 for the Deacon Assistance Fund, used to help individuals and families in times of need. The Caring Cupboard (the Lower Cape Outreach Food Pantry for Brewster, located here at BBC) received \$3,500 that will go towards purchasing additional food for the pantry. Both of our Special Offerings: American for Christ (\$11,105) and One Great Hour of Sharing (\$14,940) exceeded their goals as well. In the month of October, BBC will be receiving the World Mission Offering (WMO). The goal for the WMO is \$10,000. The special offerings and designated mission giving have been tremendous.

The area that we are behind, and need some help with, is the Stewardship Budget. Through the first 8.5 months of the year, BBC is well below the budget in both stewardship and expenses (in the 2023 budget that was passed at our Annual Meeting in February). The good news is that BBC is spending less than we expected in payroll, operations, ministry, outreach, and Missions. Unfortunately, our stewardship/giving has been less than we forecasted, too. Currently, BBC is operating with a deficit in the amount of \$21,000. This means our expenses have exceeded what has come in through stewardship giving. Our hope is that in the next 3 months, BBC will move back into the positive in this area. Thank you again for your support of BBC in everything we do!




CHRISTIAN MEN'S LUNCHIEON BBC Fellowship Hall

The Brewster Health Department, in conjunction with the Council on Aging, Cape Cod Healthcare Pharmacy and the Brewster Local Emergency Planning Committee, is hosting our annual Flu and COVID Booster clinic on October 12 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. at Our Lady of the Cape Church Parish Center Parking Lot, 468 Stony Brook Road.

Available vaccinations:

- 1. Influenza Vaccine Regular (3 yo+) and Senior Dose (65 yo+)
- 2. COVID Monovalent Vaccine *NEW* Moderna (12 yo+)

Instructions before you arrive:

PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED. Residents can schedule an appointment by:

- calling CC Healthcare Central Scheduling at 508-862-7000 option 1
- searching for a flu/COVID vaccine appointment in MyChart or
- visiting Cape Cod Healthcare <u>MyChart Schedule an Appointment (capecodhealth.org)</u>
- 1. You will need to schedule an appointment for each person being vaccinated. For help with online registration, call the COA at 508-896-2737. Please arrive for the first scheduled appointment if you are receiving multiple vaccines, or you are accompanying another family member or friend whose appointments are scheduled for a later time.
- 2. Bring your insurance card for billing; there is no co-pay. Vaccine is also available for the uninsured.
- 3. Wear short sleeves or clothing with easy access to the upper arm.
- 4. Leave pets at home for everyone's safety.
- 5. Participants will remain in their vehicles and be guided through the clinic.
- 6. Stay home if you are feeling sick on the day of the clinic.

Short-term uses would include lodging for clergy seeking vacation, rest, and renewal, and for visiting musicians, speakers, and others who would share their gifts and enhance activities at BBC, providing room for our guests who might be involved in the life of our church and community. As we once again approach the holiday seasons of giving thanks and ex-
