And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. Luke 2:10 (King James Version)

As the calendar turns to the final month of 2023, many people are increasingly afraid and fearful. Whether it's looking back at what's happened in the year that's drawing to a close, coping with events that are still taking place in our own lives, families, nation and around the world, or

looking ahead to what might happen in the coming year, fear is a growing and increasingly present emotion. I don't need to list the reasons or causes of fear because the personal ones are unique to each of us, and the larger

ones get plenty of attention.

For those of us who are followers of Christ and who trust in God, we are people who believe that faith is more powerful than fear. We recognize that there is no courage without fear. As we follow and seek to become more like Jesus we're called to walk in the same way that Jesus did, choosing responses that are grounded in our relationship with God. This is what the Apostle Paul was trying to do in writing to his younger and somewhat wavering colleague in ministry Timothy.

Paul writes in 2 Timothy 1:7 (NKJV), "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind."
We want this truth to guide us in all the seasons and situations we face in life.

In worship throughout the month of December, we'll be celebrating the season of Advent, remembering Jesus' birth and Christ's promise to return. Leading up to and including worship on Christmas Eve we'll be focusing on how the Christian

ABCUSA News...by Pastor Doug Scalise

During the second week of November, I received a call from Rev. Nikita McCallister who is the incoming President of the ABCUSA. Her term begins January 1, 2024, and runs for two years. I am The American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts Representative to the ABCUSA Board of General Ministries which the President leads. We also have a new leader for our denomination; the Rev. Dr. Gina Jacobs-Strain will be the General Secretary starting in January. This is a key time of transition for our denomination.

Rev. McCallister has asked me if I would serve as the **Chaplain for the General Board**. This is a volunteer role; it doesn't involve me leaving BBC. The Chaplain also has a place on the Executive Committee which is composed of the key top leaders of the denomination. As Chaplain I'll need to attend two additional meetings a year, each three days in length in March and September respectively, and I'll need to arrive a day earlier for the two meetings each year in June and November which would make those 4-day commitments instead of three. Accepting this role means annually I'll be giving the denomination two weeks of volunteer time. Jill and I talked and prayed about it, and I spoke with our sons Nathan and Greg about the invitation also. They all believe I should accept this invitation and seek to serve the ABCUSA in this way. I appreciate BBC's Leadership Council's encouragement as well.

Unfortunately, the first meeting I'll attend is March 7-9, 2024, which means I can't be present for the 2024 Thrive Cape Cod Conference that I've been part of planning, organizing, and participating in since Ben Feldott, Charles Galda of Vision New England, and I began it. I feel like serving as Chaplain is something I should do at this time, and I hope that you will all be pleased to know one of your pastors is serving the larger church in this way.

TABCOM LEADERSHIP DAY

TABCOM Leadership Day will be held at the Federated Church in Hudson on January 20, 2024 from 9:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

The main speaker will be Dr. Greg Mamula (photo to the right). Dr. Mamula is the youngest among regional ministers for American Baptist Churches-USA. He is the transitional minister for ABC of Nebraska.

Dr. Mamula did his undergraduate degree at Baylor and earned his MDiv at Truett Theological Seminary. He completed his DMin degree at Northern Baptist Seminary.



Dr. Mamula regularly speaks at conferences, retreats, and workshops on various topics relating to church life and discipleship. He is the author of "Table Life: An Invitation to Everyday Discipleship."

He co-edited the book "Conflict Management and the Apostle Paul" with Dr. Scot McKnight, published 2018.

He is the creator and host of the podcast "Mission in 5". He writes occasional articles for online journals like Ethics Daily, Christian Citizen, and Word and Way.

RMMO2023: Good will come. Goodness came from the pastors, missionaries, and leaders who have served ABCUSA churches and ministries. Through your giving to RMMO2023, goodness will come back to each of them in the form of a thank you check—a tangible expression of our enduring gratitude for their service.

What is the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering?

RMMO is a congregational offering and a joint project of the American Baptist Churches USA and The Ministers and Missionaries Benefit Board. Collected annually in December from participating congregations, RMMO funds are distributed as thank you checks to ABCUSA retired ordained ministers and commissioned missionaries who have devoted 15 years or more to our denomination, as well as surviving spouses. A certain portion is also allocated for direct emergency assistance. The offering originated in the mid-1930s as the Communion Fellowship Offering and since 1977 has been known as RMMO.

The offering that we receive at our three Christmas Eve services is for the RMMO.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

November has been a great month for Brewster Baptist Church in so many ways. This has been true financially and the generosity of everyone has been tremendous! The finance team cannot thank people enough for their financial support as we continue to move forward and are able to support our ministries and missionaries, operate our building, provide for our staff, conduct outreach activities to our community, and support our community.

BBC is entering the final stretch of the year regarding our Stewardship Budget. These past few weeks, our giving has moved from a deficit of \$29,000 to a balanced budget. With a healthy December push, we should not only meet the budget but exceed our ministry goal of \$1,319,772. The expenses are very close to budgeted amounts and are currently 93.8% of the budget. Typically, BBC will spend more money in missions in December to support our missionaries which will raise our percentage closer to 100% of the budget. Expenses are tracking very close to what we anticipated.

BBC Designated and Special Offerings have continued strong throughout the year! The Deacon Fund has raised over \$36,000 to help people in need and the Food Pantry has taken in over \$3,500. The World Mission Offering (WMO) exceeded their goal with a grand total of \$12,600. Earlier this year, BBC members contributed \$63,000 for the Africa House Renovation Project. Our missionaries Bill and Ann Clemmer will be speaking on November 26 during both services and will give us an update on their ministry. They provide over 800 children with housing and education while sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with them.

Our November Holiday Fair exceeded expectations, raising \$48,000 for four local charities! This is the most money the Holiday Fair has ever given away in one year. Additionally, Pastor Doug announced last Sunday that we can participate in a matching grant of \$20,000 for a Habitat Home, providing a family with a place to live here in our Brewster community. If you would like to give to this matching grant, please specify "Habitat for Humanity" in the memo line, choose that line item online or see Pastor David Pranga.

In December, people often ask if they can give the church stock or RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) to the church for tax purposes. The church will gladly accept these gifts. Pastor David Pranga and our Treasurer David Wilcock can help you with any questions. Once again, thank you to everyone for supporting our church with your generosity!



Reflection on How You Should Respond To Evil by John Piper By Martha Dunford

This summer in my small group, led by Lee Vermont, we studied what Jesus taught about the Kingdom of Heaven through His parables. A supplementary article by John Piper was also discussed. We explored how we should think, feel, and act when evil confronts us in the form of satanic evil, natural disasters, and pain in our daily lives. Current events tell us that evil is very prevalent in our world today. Piper suggests four things we should *never do* with evil:

Never despair that God is not in control, even when evil is so prevalent. God will take what is evil and work it for good.

Never give in that life is meaningless because of evil. God's ways and judgments are unsearchable. God can bring His glory victorious over any evil.

Never yield to the idea that God is unjust, unrighteous, or sinful in the way He governs the universe, because the LORD is righteous in all His ways. He is not evil or the source of evil.

Never doubt that God is totally for you. If you are in Christ, you can trust Him. God is a loving father who takes the evil formed against his children to purify and sanctify them. God is full of mercy, and He is not angry with you.

When we put our trust in the power, goodness, and wisdom of God Almighty, we can come against any plan Satan throws at us. So, trust God and be in awe of how God defeated evil through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Thank You for Making the 2023 Holiday Fair a Huge Success!

\$48,000 to be Donated to Cape Cod Foster Closet, Homeless Prevention Council, Sharing Kindness, and Family Table Collaborative.

The in-person Brewster Baptist Church Holiday Fair was held on Saturday, November 4, and visitors from all over the Cape poured through our doors, looking for bargains and finding fellowship. Shoppers left with arms overflowing with gifts and goodies, and spirits touched by the good works of Brewster Baptist Church.

Our theme again this year was "Sharing God's Love in Practical Ways," and the Fruit of the Spirit was everywhere. It was in the serving, the baking, the knitting, the crafting, the flower arranging, the jam and the spread making, the cleaning and sorting of attic treasures and jewelry, the parking, the money counting, the Bistro dining, the break room fellowshipping, and the setting up and cleaning up at the end.

The Holiday Fair is BBC's primary fundraiser in support of our Cape Cod community and is made up of two events: the Online Silent Auction and the in-person Fair.

All totaled, **we raised \$48,000** that will be given to our four beneficiaries this year: Cape Cod Foster Closet, Homeless Prevention Council, Sharing Kindness, and Family Table Collaborative. Since our first Fair 19 years ago, **BBC has donated \$575,000 to local Cape charities**, helping those that need it most.
