A Dwelling Place for God

in a United Church

If you were to ask someone what they think of when they hear the word, "church," you'd get a variety of answers. Some people might describe the physical building where we gather for worship, fellowship, study, and small groups. Other people would describe a worship service with singing, scripture, prayer, and a message. For some individuals, when they hear the word church they think of the dear and close friends they have who add so much value, love, and encouragement to their lives. All those answers are understandable and have some validity.

Throughout the month of February, we'll be continuing our worship series based on Paul's letter to the Ephesians – Celebrating the Grace and Power of God in a United *Church*. In describing how Jews and Gentiles are one in Christ in

Ephesians 2:21-22, Paul writes, "In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God."

I want to encourage you to ponder that last phrase as you think about the church. First, Paul says, it is in Christ that the whole church in its diversity is joined and held together. In Paul's time, he was referring to Jews and Gentiles, enslaved and free, men and women. In our day, whatever differences we may have with other members of the church, Christ holds and binds us together. Second, the church

is to grow into "a holy temple in the Lord." The church is to be a place where holiness of life is fostered, developed, and growing in all of us. Growing in spiritual maturity and Christlikeness should be part of all our daily, "To Do List." Third, Paul says we are interconnected; we "are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God." Our faith is personal, but not private; it is unique to each person, but not individualistic. God's design for the church is for us to be built together spiritually into a dwelling place where God's Spirit and presence are manifested and obvious to all, and where the power of God is unleashed

and touches and transforms lives. When you hear the word "church" I hope one of your answers will be, "That's the community I'm a part of that is *built* together spiritually into a dwelling place for God."

Celebrating the Grace and Power of God

We have so much to celebrate at BBC. On Sunday, February 18, after the conclusion of our 10:00 am worship service, we will have our Annual Meeting, during which we'll look back at a year filled with God's blessings and generosity, and we'll vote to affirm our new volunteer ministry leaders and a budget for 2024. Our Bicentennial year will be memorable and will feature special events every month.

Iowa farmer Ray Kinsella hears a voice in his corn field tell him, "If you build it, he will come." He interprets this message as an instruction to build a baseball field on his farm, which leads to appearances by the ghosts of Shoeless Joe Jackson and the other seven Chicago White Sox players banned from baseball for throwing the 1919 World Series. When the voices continue, Ray seeks out a reclusive author to help him understand the meaning of the messages and the purpose for his field. "Field of Dreams" is a movie which deals with themes of faith, revelation, vocation, relationships, grief, and being able to forgive oneself and the enduring bonds that can be created even through baseball.

A proposed amendment to the bylaws will be voted on at this year's Annual Meeting. The amendment refers to selecting Core Ministry leaders. Please see page 5 for the changes.

Proposed Amendment to the Bylaws, Article IV: Core Ministries

At the Annual Meeting on February 18, 2024, the Leadership Council will propose an amendment to Article IV: Core Ministries of the Bylaws. This proposed amendment would permit a professional Christian leader who is not a Covenant Member to be eligible to become a Core Ministry Leader provided that the individual:

- Is actively involved in the life of BBC, and
- Whose professional status would be negatively impacted by becoming a Covenant Member.

If approved, this amendment would further enable the church to benefit from the knowledge, experiences and gifts of a Christian leader such as pastor, counselor, missionary, religious educator, regional and or national staff person. In addition to these changes, minor wording and format edits are proposed to add clarity to other portions of Article IV.

Proposed Amendment to BYLAWS

ARTICLE IV: CORE MINISTRIES

- **A.** The Leadership Council shall establish Core Ministries that focus on the five purposes that God has given: centering our lives around God (worship); learning to love God's family (fellowship); cultivating spiritual maturity (discipleship); contributing something back through serving (**service**); and telling others about God's love (missions and evangelism).
- B. Each Core Ministry shall be under the direction and supervision of a Pastor. The responsible Pastor shall conduct an annual review of the Core Ministry and present it to the Leadership Council.
- **C. 1.** The Pastor **responsible for the Core Ministry** shall present to the Leadership Council a Covenant Member of BBC **or**, **subject to Article IV (C)(2)**, **a professional Christian leader** to be the Core Ministry Leader. The Leadership Council shall present that Covenant Member **or**, **subject to Article IV (C)(2)**, **that professional Christian leader** for election to a one (1)- year renewable term (not to exceed six (6) consecutive years) at the BBC Annual Meeting.
- 2. After consultation with the Leadership Council the responsible Pastor may present to the Leadership Council and the Leadership Council may present to the Covenant Membership as a Core Ministry Leader a professional Christian leader (pastor, counselor, missionary, religious educator, regional or national staff person) (i) who is not a Covenant Member, (ii) who is actively involved in the life of BBC, and (iii) whose professional status would be negatively impacted by becoming a Covenant Member of Brewster Baptist Church.
- **D.** In the event a Core Ministry Leader needs to be replaced before the completion of the one (1)- year renewable term, the Leadership Council may fill that position by majority vote for a period ending at the next BBC Annual Meeting.
- **E.** All Core Ministry Leaders, Pastoral Staff, the Moderator and representatives from the Leadership Council shall meet as a group at least quarterly each year to facilitate communication concerning activities and programs at BBC.
- **F.** The **responsible** Pastor and Core Ministry Leader shall select the members of the Core Ministry Team.



We welcome all forms of needlework, and beginners to experts welcome. We look forward to sharing our talents, good company and occasionally baked goods!







