Staying Focused on God

When I was a teenager and learning how to drive a car, I had lessons as part of taking Driver's Education at Brookline High School. It was incredibly stressful having my first couple of lessons behind the wheel of a car, not in a quiet rural town like Brewster, but on the terribly busy streets of Brookline and Boston, with trolleys, bicyclists, and double-parked cars. I've never forgotten one of the things my driving instructor told me and my friend Tim in the car on our first day. She said, "Remember, your hands follow your eves,

so keep your eyes up the road in front of you. Don't just look at the end of your hood, or you'll end up rear-ending someone or driving into something. Don't be looking at a pretty girl

walking on the sidewalk, because you'll start driving toward the sidewalk." Her advice to stay focused looking up the road has saved me many times in the years since.

In May, we'll be completing our six-week series, "Teach Us to Pray" about The Lord's Prayer. The final phrase when we say The Lord's Prayer is usually, "for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen." I hear those words in a similar way to my Driver's Ed

instructor's advice. It's a way of reminding ourselves to stay focused on God, to look as far down the road as possible to our destiny with God, which helps us steer safely to our desired destination.

Have you ever noticed how sometimes it seems like dogs and their owners resemble each other a little bit? Have you ever felt like the longer some people are married, the more they look, act, or speak alike, even completing each other's sentences because they know each other so well? As

God is a part of our lives day after day, week after week, month after month, year after year, hopefully we begin to look and act and speak more like the God we've been walking

with and living with through the years. We don't pray, "mine is the glory," because our focus is on God and not ourselves.

The Lord's Prayer closes by returning our focus to God, with whom it began. The more we focus on God in heaven, the more inspired we are on earth. In *The Great House of God*, Max Lucado shares the story of a sociologist who "accompanied a group of mountain climbers on an expedition. Among other things, he observed a direct correlation between cloud cover and

contentment. When there was no cloud cover and the peak was in view, the climbers were energetic and cooperative. When the gray clouds eclipsed the view of the mountaintop, though, the climbers were sullen and selfish." The same thing can happen to us. As long as our eyes are on God's majesty and glory, there's a bounce in our step and light in our eye. But when our eyes focus on the dirt beneath our feet we may end up grumbling about every rock and crevice we have to cross.

Richard Foster writes in his book, *Prayer: Finding the Heart's True Home*, "The truth of the matter is, we all come to prayer with a tangled mess of motives – altruistic and selfish, merciful and hateful, loving and bitter. Frankly this side of eternity we will never unravel the good from the bad, the pure from the impure. But what I have come to see is that God is big enough to receive us with all our mixture."

The Lord's Prayer is brief; yet, within its few words, there is depth that we can easily miss, and to which we can return daily. It's a guide to the Christian life, contentment, freedom, and peace we all need.

As we conclude this series, I hope as you pray The Lord's Prayer from now on, that you may hear it and live it in a different way.

The Financial Team would like to thank everyone for their generous support of Brewster Baptist Church in 2024. It is great to see that BBC is doing so well and is above budget in stewardship! The following numbers are current through April 23, 2024.

The stewardship budget is \$451,408. Currently, we are just above budget at \$451,655. For comparison, BBC took in \$380,000 at this point last year. This has been a huge jump in the first third of the year.

Our current expenses are \$451,408. Every major area is working below their budget, coming in at \$411,819. These five areas are: payroll/benefits, operations, ministry, outreach, and missions. This has put BBC in a strong position for the next few months.

In March, BBC received our offering for AFC – America for Christ. Our goal was \$7,500, and we received \$8,000. Our monthly Deacon Offering has received over \$27,000 in 2024. The Deacon Offering allows us to help families and individuals who are in need. Our investments are off to a strong start in 2024 – currently, they are up \$68,000!

This year, there have already been several capital projects completed at Brewster Baptist Church. BBC has installed and upgraded our security cameras (\$5,800), installed two sets of accessible doors in the foyer area (\$8,690), and installed a new fire panel (\$17,750). Currently, the kitchen is under construction – it should be done by May 1.

Overall, BBC is doing very well financially in 2024. We are grateful for your financial support, which can continue to be given on Sunday mornings, by mail, or online. If you need any help or have any questions, please contact Pastor David Pranga or Treasurer, David Wilcock.

On Sunday, April 21, the Old Colony Association of The American Baptist Churches of MA held an Ordination Council for Greg Scalise. An Ordination Council is the final step in preparing for full-time vocational ministry. Greg read his ordination paper section by section reflecting his spiritual journey and core beliefs and answered questions. The pastors and delegates present voted unanimously that Greg be approved for ordination within the ABCUSA.

We will be hosting a service of Ordination for Greg on Sunday, May 19 at 3:30 p.m. This will be the day after Greg and his wife Marci graduate from Gordon

Conwell Theological Seminary. Greg also has the honor of being chosen by the faculty to be one of the student

speakers at graduation.

The following week, Greg, Marci and Victor will be moving to Manchester, NH, where Greg will be the Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Manchester.

The Scalise Family is deeply grateful for all the love, support, and encouragement that Greg has received throughout his life from the people of BBC.

In addition to B&G's routine ongoing cleaning, upkeep and maintenance activities for church grounds and buildings (including two parsonages properties), special note to current projects include:



Automatic Doors

The installation of new automatic door openers to both the right-hand entry doors to the main lobby area was completed in April. This improvement to the accessibility of the church from both the front driveway and back parking lot area provides great assistance to those individuals in wheelchairs, walkers, or who have difficulty with the weight of the doors.

Fire Panel Replacement

The fire alarm system upgrade project for the main church building was completed in April and is now in service. The upgrade includes a new main panel, which communicates with the Brewster Fire Department, as well as individual pull stations throughout the building.

Kitchen Renovation Project

The kitchen upgrade project, which began in April, is well underway and expected to be ready to return to routine operations in May. To date, the floor has been replaced with a seamless, spill resistant commercial restaurant grade floor material that reduces the slip and trip risk hazard to people working in the kitchen. A ten-burner commercial grade stove has been installed, replacing the old six-burner stove, providing better capacity to accommodate large dining events. The residential style storage cabinets have been removed and will be replaced with restaurant style open shelves. This allows easier and quicker access to items used in the kitchen.

The Meditation Garden

The Wednesday (1:00 – 3:00 p.m.) volunteer garden team has started up for this season of maintaining and improving our meditation garden area near the backside of the rear area parking lot. All are welcome to join on a regular basis, or as your time allows, to help with the gardening activities that beautify this special place.



Good Neighbor Fund Information

To help coordinate local fundraising and philanthropic efforts to provide essential services to Brewster residents, the Town of Brewster has established the Good Neighbor Fund. Residents may apply for financial assistance for urgent situations that would help them avoid a crisis, such as homelessness or loss of heat, as well as non-urgent situations, such as assistance with childcare, after school care, summer programs, utility bills, medical bills, etc. Since the inception of the Good Neighbor Fund (originally created in 2020 as the COVID Relief Fund), the Town has awarded over \$39,000 to more than 26 Brewster residents in need. Thanks to your generous donations, the Town has been able to help our residents with mortgage and rent payments, medical bills, childcare costs, utility bills, car payments, insurance payments, and other needs. The current balance of the fund is just under \$5,000.
