Being the Greatest vs. Being the Most Childlike

Human beings have long been interested in, and admired, whoever is the greatest. While it's good to make the most of our ability, time, and potential, the hunger for prominence – being significantly important or well-known – is a temptation. Some people are well-known, yet they've done nothing of significance – we all can think of some people in that category. There are other people who are significantly important, who aren't well known in our

celebrity and fame obsessed society. The hunger for attention and importance – the desire for prominence – is an ancient one for humanity, even in death; consider the pyramids of Egypt or the Taj Mahal in

India.

prominence, adulation, for being known as the greatest, is an old problem. After everything the disciples had heard Jesus say about humility and servanthood, after all they had witnessed of his life of simplicity, almost two-thirds of the way through Matthew's gospel, they're still thinking about who is the greatest. While the disciples' question focuses on who is the greatest, Jesus moves the emphasis to the kingdom of heaven. The disciples were likely asking the question to see how they could become the greatest, how they might move up the ladder of importance. Jesus pops that balloon.

"He called a child, whom he put among them, and said, 'Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever becomes humble like this child is

the greatest in the kingdom of heaven."


I'm going to be preaching on that passage, and this theme, on Father's Day, June 16, when we will be welcoming new members into the church. Jesus invites us to follow him and to be part of the church as children of God. One aspect of becoming like a child is we need to be as teachable as children to participate in God's kingdom by learning God's ways and living accordingly. One of the coolest things to


me about children, and observing our still very young grandsons who have not yet learned to speak, is watching their eyes – and you can almost hear their little brains whirring with activity as they're processing all they are hearing, seeing, touching, and sticking in their mouth.

Children are always learning, for good and for bad, from what they observe going on around them.

There is also perhaps no creature on earth, as far as I know, that is more dependent on others for its survival for longer than human children. Fish, turtles, and many other creatures – they're on their own from the moment they're born, and the world can be a tough place with other creatures just waiting to eat you. Human beings are dependent on their parents or guardians, not for minutes, but for years. Entering the Kingdom of God like a child means recognizing our dependence on God and learning to trust in and depend on God, who can be trusted as no human parent can be, no matter how devoted.

Entering the Kingdom of God as a child means we're teachable, and we recognize

Children are greatly influenced by those who are around them and by what they learn when they're young. A lot of the most important things we learn in life we learn when we're children.

As Robert Fulghum wrote in a best-selling book, "Most of what I really need to know about how to live, and what to do, and how to be, I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate school mountain, but there in the sandbox at nursery school... These are the things I learned: Share everything. Play fair. Don't hit people. Put things back where you found them. Clean up your own mess. Don't take things that aren't yours. Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody... When you go out into the world, watch for traffic, hold hands, and stick together."

Don't strive to be the greatest in the kingdom of heaven; seek to be the most childlike, humble, teachable, full of wonder, always learning and growing. That's what the Lord is looking for in each of us.

The Financial Team would like to thank everyone for their generous support of Brewster Baptist Church. It is through your gifts that we can do so many wonderful things. Overall, BBC is doing very well in Stewardship. The following numbers are through May 16, 2024.

<u>Journeying</u>

The Stewardship budget is \$550,153. Currently, we are just below budget, as we have received \$542,563. Our current

expense is only \$455,625. Every major area is operating below budget, which is great. The five major areas are payroll/benefits, operations, ministry, outreach, and missions. This has put BBC in a strong position going into summer!

BBC has done quite well in our special offerings in 2024. This year, our Deacon Offerings have received \$29,275. This allows us to help families and individuals who are in need. We have also received \$8,000 for our America for Christ offering. Thank you for exceeding our goal of \$7,500.

This year, there have been many capital projects completed at Brewster Baptist Church. BBC has installed security cameras (\$5,800); accessible doors in the foyer area (\$16,986); installed a new fire panel (\$17,475); and we are now in the process of restoring the piano in the Sanctuary (\$4,620). BBC can do all these projects because we are in a healthy position financially!

Overall, BBC is doing very well in 2024. We are incredibly grateful for your financial support. You can give on Sunday mornings, by mail, or online. BBC does accept stock as well. If you need any help or have any questions, please contact Pastor David Pranga or David Wilcock, Church Treasurer.

Behind the scenes, the Sextons and the B&G team continue to perform multiple activities to support the various ministries of BBC. For the second quarter of the year, a total of 63 area set-ups (an average of over five per week) of tables and chairs between Fellowship and Community Halls have been typically scheduled. These events and meeting include BBC Sunday after-service coffee hour and/or breakfast, Christian Men's Luncheon, Cub Scout meetings, Women's Bible Study, Family Movie Night, and memorial receptions as called for. Community-related gatherings included Red Cross Blood Drives, Lower Cape Outreach Council health support demonstrations, Nauset Garden Club meetings, Bayberry Quilters, Brewster Town Band, Brewster Pond Coalition, and two weekly AA meetings.

With spring/summer weather returning, B&G June activities will also include our mowing team's weekly cutting of the grass around the Main Street parsonage and back field area, hedge trimming, power washing of several areas of the church exterior, and repainting the designated accessible parking space decals near the church entrances.

Chariots of Fire is a 1981 British historical sports drama film, directed by Hugh Hudson and written by Colin Welland. It's based on the true story of two British athletes seeking to compete in the 1924 Olympics: Eric Liddell, a devout Scottish Christian who runs for the glory of God, and Harold Abrahams, an English Jew who runs to overcome prejudice.

Ben Cross and Ian Charleson star as Abrahams and Liddell. The film reflects the self-discipline and sacrifice each man makes,

as well as the choices each makes, as he seeks to achieve his goal. They will sacrifice anything to achieve their goals, except their honor.

Chariots of Fire was nominated for seven Academy Awards and won four, including Best Picture, Best Original Screenplay and Best Original Score for Vangelis' electronic theme. The film's title was inspired by the line "Bring me my Chariot of fire!" from the William Blake poem adapted into the British hymn and unofficial English anthem "Jerusalem"; the hymn is heard at the end of the film. The original phrase "chariot(s) of fire" is from 2 Kings 2:11 and 2 Kings 6:17.

Chariots of Fire is an inspiring movie that will cause you to reflect on your own race of faith and make you at least want to go for a walk, if not a run!

End of School Celebration Join us during the last school holiday for ice cream and


