REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR NATE

From the earliest generations of God's people, there has been a longstanding tradition of marking places where the Lord's grace and glory are revealed. When the Israelites finally crossed over into the land of promise, they stacked twelve stones, one upon another, remembering the Lord for the great faithfulness He had shown them in bringing them to this place. In 1 Samuel 7, the eponymous prophet laid another stone, this time to memorialize the time when God delivered them from the hand of the Philistines. Dating back further is yet another such instance. In Genesis 32, the patriarch,

Jacob, named a small town in the distant land of Haran "Peniel," for it is there that he "saw God face to face, and yet what was spared" (Genesis 32:30).

After exploiting his ailing father Isaac, and stealing his twin brother's birthright,

Jacob found himself alone, fearing for his life. It is there that the Lord met Jacob in a whirlwind of a night, and the two actually fought one another until daybreak (the Hebrew word 'abaq literally means "wrestled"). The Lord wrestled Jacob, but He let him live. He spared Jacob, and it changed the trajectory of Jacob's life.

There have been many times when I have found myself wrestling with God, and yet, He spared me; times when my will and His will didn't align, where my impulse to run superseded my desire to obey. I have hurt those I love. I have cascaded down the dark trenches of sin and denial. But yet, each and every time, the still, small voice of the Spirit confronts me, and we wrestle. I don't deserve the Lord's grace. I am in


no way entitled to, or worthy of, His forgiveness. And yet, the Lord spares me. I see God face to face, and my life is spared. He turns me back on course.

There's a reason the Israelites, throughout their history, have set up markers to remember where God has been. Because, if we don't, we, as human beings, are prone to forget. When we find ourselves lost, distant, or hesitant in any way to relinquish control and obey, we can look back to those places where God has shown up before, and realize the need to wrestle is over; we don't need to fight anymore. He's

spared us before, and that's more than enough. We've experienced the peace of His presence in and around us; the desire to look elsewhere is quelled.

As I return to Brewster Baptist Church, now as Pastor of Discipleship, I am flooded with

memories of where God has shown up in my life, times when we've wrestled. The sanctuary, the playground, the Student Ministry area, the Fellowship Hall—they're all monuments that commemorate where the Lord has spared me, and my life was changed. As we look ahead to beginning this new Fall series on "Reimagining the Church", I invite you to ponder whether the building of Brewster Baptist Church is a monument for you. When you walk through these halls, are you reminded of where God has shown up? Do you feel His grace when you encounter people in this congregation who have shaped and formed you in your spiritual journey? Is 1848 Main Street in Brewster a place that memorializes where you've been, and where Christ is leading ~ Pastor Nate Ryan you?

FINANCIAL UPDATE

As we enter the fourth quarter of the year, overall, Brewster Baptist Church is doing outstanding with our 2024 budget. This is quite remarkable, as the Financial Team had put together an ambitious budget. The great news is that everyone has stepped up to the plate. Praise God!

The following numbers represent income and expenses through September 19, 2024. The stewardship budget through the first 37 weeks was set at \$1,043,880. Currently, we are exceeding that budget goal at \$1,055,956! Our expenses to date are only \$940,236, which is well below our budget. All five major categories: Salary & Benefits, Operation, Ministry, Evangelism/Communication, and Missions, are currently below budget. Thank you to everyone for monitoring their budgets so closely. The Financial Team expects spending to increase in payroll/benefits with the addition of Pastor Nate Ryan. Typically, Missions spends majority of their budget in the last quarter as well. Overall, BBC finances are healthy!

Missions have always been a priority at BBC, represented in both the annual budget and through our special offerings. In October, BBC will be taking one such special offering, the World Mission Offering (WMO)—with a goal of \$10,000. Earlier this year, we received \$13,000+ for the One Great Hour of Sharing offering (OGHS) and \$8,000 for America For Christ (AFC) offering. BBC has received over \$48,000 for our Deacon Assistance Fund.

In 2024, there have been many capital projects that have been completed in both the church and in the parsonage (getting things ready for Pastor Nate Ryan). In the past few months, BBC has installed a new hot water heater, a new boiler, updated kitchen flooring and a new water line to the street. The total cost of these projects was \$28,700. Previous capital projects have included installing security cameras, replacing fire panels, adding two sets of accessible doors in the foyer area, kitchen renovation, piano repairs and upgrading sound systems in both Fellowship Hall and the Chapel. Thus far, BBC has spent over \$111,000 in 2024 on capital projects.

Overall, BBC is doing very well financially. We are incredibly grateful for your financial support. If you'd like to learn more about donating shares of stock, please contact Pastor

Required Minimum Distributions

As the end of the year approaches, it is never too soon to consider smart tax strategies.

For those who are 70 ½ years old and older, you are subject to a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA each year.



To minimize your tax implications, and to directly benefit Brewster Baptist Church, you can request a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your plan's administrator. Any amount distributed to BBC from the IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (up to \$105,000) will not be taxed as ordinary income.




A Message from Pastor Nate

- COVID Moderna Vaccine Regular (12 years of age+)


Instructions before you arrive:

PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED. Residents can schedule an appointment by:

- calling Cape Cod Healthcare Central Scheduling at 508-862-7000, selecting option 1
- searching for a flu/COVID vaccine appointment in MyChart or
- visiting Cape Cod Healthcare Vaccination Appointments | Cape Cod Healthcare (have your Insurance card available)
- 1. You will need to schedule an appointment for each person being vaccinated. For help with online registration, call the Cape Cod Healthcare Central Scheduling at 508-862-7000, selecting option 1. Please arrive for the **FIRST** scheduled appointment if you are receiving multiple vaccines, or you are accompanying another family member or friend whose appointments are scheduled for a later time.
- 2. Bring your insurance card for billing; there is no co-pay. Vaccines are also available for the uninsured.
- 3. Wear short sleeves or clothing with easy access to the upper arm.
- 4. Leave pets at home for everyone's safety.
- 5. Participants will remain in their vehicles and be guided through the clinic.
- 6. Stay home if you are feeling sick on the day of the clinic.
