Celebrating 200 Years of Faith, Community, and Service: A Milestone for Our Church

2024

This year marks a remarkable milestone in the life of our church—a milestone that speaks to the endurance of faith, the strength of community, and the transformative power of service. As we plan to gather on Monday, December 23, at 6:30 p.m. to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of Brewster Baptist Church, we pause to reflect on how far we've come, to honor those who have gone before us, and to look forward to the future with renewed hope and purpose as we begin a third century of ministry.

Founded on December 23, 1824, our church began as a small group of faithful individuals seeking to worship, grow in their faith, support one another, and share the good news of God's love in Jesus. The world then was vastly

Over two centuries, what began as a small, humble gathering of believers has grown significantly, and evolved, adapting to the needs of the times, while remaining firmly rooted in the teaching and example of Jesus Christ.

As we look back over the last two hundred years, we recognize the countless individuals who have made this journey possible. From the founding members who gathered under humble circumstances to the generations of clergy and lay leaders

who have faithfully served and guided us, our history is rich with stories of commitment, sacrifice, and love that we've been sharing throughout the year, thanks to the wonderful weekly bulletin inserts prepared by Sharon Kautz.

One of the greatest legacies of our church is the sense of community that's been cultivated here. Whether through Sunday worship, Bible studies, small groups, outreach ministries, or fellowship gatherings, our church has served as a

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Thank you very much for your financial contributions in 2024. In August, Brewster Baptist Church welcomed a new pastor to our staff, Pastor Nate Ryan. This is on top of an ambitious budget that was set for 2024. Now, we are in the final few weeks of our budget year. We are very thankful for our first-time givers, as well as our regular tithers and givers, too.

The following numbers represent the income and expenses through November 21, 2024. Currently, our stewardship budget is \$1,300,000. BBC has taken in \$1,253,181 which represents 96.4% of the stewardship budget. Our expenses are only at \$1,211,760 which represents 93.2% of the budget. Our retain earnings are currently \$41,421 for 2024.

Missions have always been a priority at BBC represented in both our annual budget and through our designated and special offerings. In addition, BBC raised \$50,000 through our Holiday Fair. All \$50,000 will be given away to three charities on Cape Cod. The World Mission Offering received over \$24,000. The goal was only \$10,000. BBC also received a gift of \$10,000 towards Sofia Baptist Church. In addition, our Deacon Assistance Fund has received over \$66,000 this year. This money goes to financially assist people who are struggling and going through tough times. The Deacon Assistance Fund helps them with paying their rent, utilities, car payments, medical expenses, and food. Overall, BBC received over \$125,000 in designated and special offerings, along with \$50,000 from the Holiday Fair. Praise God!

In 2024, there have been several capital projects that have been completed in both the church and parsonage. BBC has spent over \$133,000 in total for all the projects. In the past month, BBC had to replace the projector in the sanctuary. The cost of the new projector was \$21,652. We did receive a \$10,000 gift towards this projector. BBC received a \$25,000 gift from The Eddy Foundation to cover some of the capital expenses in 2024. Other capital projects have included new security cameras, accessible doors, a renovation of the kitchen, a piano project, and upgrades to the sound systems in Fellowship Hall and the Chapel. There was also additional work completed in the parsonage, including installing a new boiler, and hot water heater, and replacing a water line.

Overall, BBC is doing very well financially, thanks to the incredible financial support we've received. As the year comes to a close, please consider giving an additional donation to help us close the year well financially. Required Minimum Distributions

As the end of the year approaches, it is a good time to consider smart tax strategies.

For those who are 70 ½ years old and older, you are subject to a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA each year.

To minimize your tax implications, and to directly benefit Brewster Baptist Church,



you can request a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your plan's administrator. Any amount distributed to BBC from the IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (up to \$105,000) will not be taxed as ordinary income.

If you have not already taken your RMD for 2024, please consider this easy and effective way of lowering your taxes and helping to fulfill the mission of Brewster Baptist Church. Please see David Hill or Pastor David Pranga for more information.





A Message from Pastor Nate

As we look forward to 2025 and a new century of faithful ministry here at Brewster Baptist Church, the pastoral staff feels it's imperative that we prioritize the spiritual formation of our congregation in the year ahead. We are called to not only believe in Jesus, but actually follow Jesus – conforming our hearts, minds, and desires to His in everything we do.

I am very excited to announce some new opportunities our church is launching to help aid in this process. These programs are designed for people across the spectrum of spiritual maturity, from those who have not yet given their lives to Christ but find themselves asking important questions about faith, to those who've been attending church for years and are just looking for new ways to dig deeper. Hopefully there's an opportunity for you.

Alpha Class

The first opportunity is Alpha, a ten-week course designed for those who like asking questions. Perhaps you are new to the church and are struggling to understand the concepts and vocabulary the Bible teaches us about. Maybe you are a seeker, one who doesn't quite know yet what they think about Jesus, but are intrigued by His message of love and acceptance in a world that lacks it. Maybe you struggle with doubt; you believe in Jesus but are not quite sure



how the hope of God fits together with the pain and suffering we see all around us in the world. If any of this resonates with you, then this Alpha ten-week course might be a good fit for you.

Alpha began in 1977 out of Holy Trinity Church in London, England, and since 1990, has been faithfully led by pastor Nicky Gumbel and his wife, Pippa. Each week, following a meal, Alpha participants gather to watch a video around one of the core tenants of the Christian faith: God the Father, Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, the Church, the Bible, Good vs. Evil, etc. Then, periodically throughout the video, special time is allotted for round-table discussions to engage with these topics ourselves. Hopefully, by the end of the ten weeks, you will have found a new, robust understanding of the Christian faith and the part you have to play in faithfully following Jesus becomes visible. You can register for Alpha online through our church website or on the church app. Please be on the lookout for dates and times when these become available!

Spiritual Gifts Class

The second discipleship opportunity is a Spiritual Gifts Class, intended for those who are faithfully committed Christians who are looking for new ways to practically use their faith in action in service to the local church and the world. In *Romans 12:6*, the Apostle Paul states that we, as the body of Christ "have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us." These many gifts include: prophecy, faith, service, teaching, encouragement, generosity, leadership, mercy, and others, and they are all given by the same Holy Spirit,



who is God's presence dwelling in us. As we seek to become more like Jesus and proclaim the good news of His reign on earth, we use our gifts to equip those in need, so the church can be built up and the new humanity founded in love God has designed might be made evident to all. If you do not know what spiritual gifts you possess or would like assistance in helping equip others to use their gifts for the edification of the church, please consider coming to our Spiritual Gifts Class led by Pastor David this January. This class will be offered on Thursday evenings from 6:30 – 8:00 p.m. starting on January 9, 2025.

Reading the Bible in a Year

The final discipleship opportunity is setting the goal of reading through the entire Bible in one year, something that all of our membership at BBC can do. In the digital age we live in, reading the Bible has never been more accessible over the course of human history than it is now. Despite this accessibility, the disturbing reality is that biblical literacy in the United States continues to decline, and this decline in biblical literacy is present even in our churches. With the abundance of printed copies, e-books, podcasts, websites, and apps that make God's Word a simple fingertip away, less and less people are experiencing the transforming power of His redemptive story for His people. In addition to the Alpha class, the leader of Alpha, Pastor Nicky Gumbel, has created a devotional app with daily 20-minute Scripture readings that, once completed, take you through the entire Bible in a year. Each



day, Pastor Gumbel takes you through a reading from the Wisdom literature (Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes), the Old Testament, and the New Testament, with helpful reflections and prayer exercises to do in between. We think this is a great opportunity for any members in our congregation who possess a smartphone to make a daily reading of Scripture part of your routine. You can find the Alpha Bible app right on the app store!

especially busy month. In addition to our normal Sunday morning and Sunday evening programming, on November 1, we brought a group of our students to Ryan Family Amusements for a fun night

of bowling and karaoke. In addition, many of our students volunteered in various capacities for the Holiday Fair, which raised over \$50,000 for local charities across Cape Cod.

We also had 11 students participate in a leaf raking service project for elderly members of our church community who were physically unable to take care of their yards this fall. Our students worked hard, but never failed to have a smile on their faces. Their willingness to serve and "do good" imitates the life and teachings of Jesus. We also had the pleasure of welcoming four of our students to active church membership on November 24. After professing their faith and going through the waters of baptism in Cape Cod Bay on September 8, Hunter Marshall, Charlie Kautz, J.D. Fougere, and Hannah Pranga have decided to call Brewster Baptist Church their church home. We look forward to helping encourage them to identify and use their spiritual gifts for the edification of the body of Christ and the rest of the membership of BBC.

Looking Ahead to 2025

As we look forward to 2025, perhaps the biggest student ministry event we organize throughout the year is on the horizon. On January 31, we will be taking our students for a weekend retreat at Camp Berea in Hebron, NH. In addition to group games, a snow-tubing hill, and many other fun winter activities, Berea is a time when our students will hear the Gospel message presented and have an opportunity to



respond to the invitation of Jesus to give their lives to Him. Many of our students, over the past twenty years, have made decisions to follow Jesus or recommit their faith while at Camp Berea, Pastor Nate included. Nate came to know Jesus as His Lord and Savior through a transformative weekend at Berea in 2008, and he is overjoyed with the opportunity to continue this BBC tradition by bringing our students there now.

At BBC, the vast majority of the Student Ministry budget is earmarked to help offset the cost expectations put on parents to make this weekend a possibility for our students. Camp Berea's cost for a winter weekend is \$265 per student, and at BBC, we have only been asking parents to contribute \$75 per student. With that said, we recognize the increasing financial challenges facing many individuals and families in 2024, especially given that many of our families have two, three, or even four students currently enrolled in our program. Over the years, as the number of students in our youth group continues to increase, BBC's Student Ministry budget is strained to maintain the commitment to help offset the costs of attending Camp Berea.



Shoppers left with arms overflowing with gifts and goodies, and spirits touched by the good works of Brewster Baptist Church.

Our theme again this year was "Sharing God's Love in Practical Ways," and the Fruit of the Spirit was everywhere. It was in the serving, the baking, the knitting, the crafting, the flower arranging, the jam and the spread making, the cleaning and sorting of attic treasures and jewelry, the parking, the money counting, the Bistro dining, the break room fellowshipping, and the setting up and cleaning up at the end.

The Holiday Fair is BBC's primary fundraiser in support of our Cape Cod community and is made up of two events: the Online Silent Auction and the in-person Fair.

All totaled, we raised \$50,000 that will be given to our three beneficiaries this year: Lower Cape Outreach Council, Faith Family Kitchen, and Dream Day on Cape Cod. Since our first Fair 20 years ago, BBC has donated \$625,000 to 25 local Cape charities, helping those whoneed it most.
