THE GARDENS OF GOD

The LORD will guide you continually, And satisfy your soul in drought, And strengthen your bones; **You shall be like a watered garden**, And like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail.

Isaiah 58:11 (NKJV)

The Bible is rich with imagery and symbolism, and gardens play a significant role in its narrative — reflecting themes of creation, love, betrayal, and redemption. Among the pivotal gardens mentioned in the Bible are the Garden of Eden, the Garden of Love in the *Song of Solomon*, the Garden of Gethsemane, and the Garden of God in *Revelation*.

The Garden of Eden, described in *Genesis 2*, is the first, and most iconic, garden in the Bible. It was a place of beauty, created by God as a dwelling place for humanity. The garden was filled with trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food, including the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (*Genesis 2:8-9*). This garden symbolized a perfect relationship between God and humanity, where Adam and Eve lived in harmony with nature and with each other, free from sin and shame (*Genesis 2:25*). However, it also became the site of humanity's first disobedience, marking the beginning of sin and separation from God (*Genesis 3:1-7*).

In the *Song of Solomon*, a different kind of garden is described — a garden of human

love. Here, Solomon uses garden imagery to express the beauty and intimacy of romantic love. The beloved is likened to a garden, enclosed and locked, symbolizing exclusivity and purity in love (*Song of Solomon 4:12-15*). This garden represents a place of mutual delight and satisfaction, where love flourishes. It echoes the harmony and perfection of the Garden of Eden, highlighting the potential for human relationships to reflect divine love.

The Garden of Gethsemane, mentioned in the New Testament, is a stark contrast to the Garden of Eden. It was a place where Jesus went to pray, and it became

infamous as the site of his betrayal by Judas (*Matthew 26:36-38*). In Gethsemane, Jesus faced intense spiritual struggle, praying in anguish as he contemplated the cross (*Mark 14:34-36*). Gethsemane symbolizes the struggle with sin and the ultimate

sacrifice that Jesus made to redeem humanity.

Finally, the Bible concludes with a vision of a future garden in *Revelation 22*. This garden is part of the New Jerusalem, where God dwells with humanity once more. The river of life flows through it, and the tree of life bears fruit every month, symbolizing eternal life and restoration (*Revelation 22:1-2*). This garden represents the ultimate fulfillment of God's plan for humanity — a return to relationship, free from sin and sorrow.

BBC Goes to the Movies

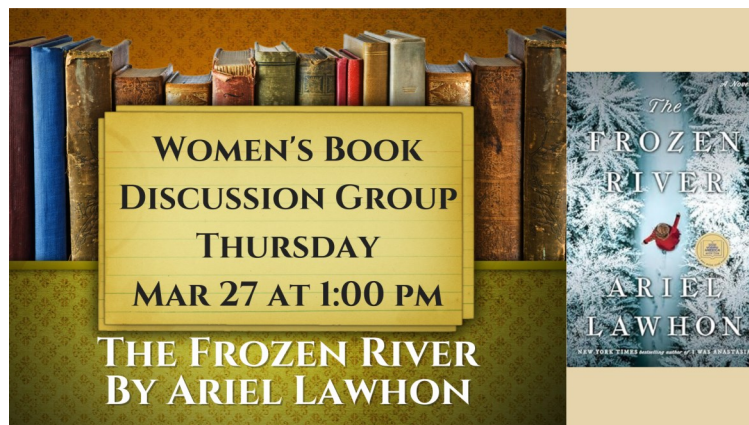
On Thursday, March 20 at 6:00 p.m., we'll watch, "The Day the Earth Stood Still," a 1951 American science fiction classic. Set against the backdrop of the Cold War, the movie features Klaatu, a humanoid alien visitor who arrives unexpectedly in Washington, D.C. with a powerful message for humanity: to live peacefully or face obliteration. This message, delivered with a blend of timely political commentary and spiritual allegory, encourages viewers to consider themes of peace, unity, and the potential consequences of war and aggression. Klaatu's interactions with ordinary people, his demonstration of power, and ultimate message offer a compelling narrative that resonates with contemporary issues. The film prompts consideration of our responsibilities to each other and the whole planet, while exploring the themes of fear versus curiosity, fear versus faith, and the fear of "the other." The movie still has much to teach us almost 75 years since its release.

Five Things By Martha Dunford

Kaela McKaig has a podcast, *His word, my walk*, that is helping me to grow more Christlike. One podcast was very interesting to me because Kaela discusses five ways she prays as she starts her day. She definitely relates to Jesus as her best friend. When she wakes up in the morning, the first thing she says is, "Good Morning, Jesus." (Also, she talks to Him all throughout the day because she knows her good friend is close by her side in everything she does.) After she says good morning, she thanks Jesus for five things that have recently touched her. Big or small, it doesn't matter. The important thing is to know that all good things come from God. Next, she states an *I feel* sentence. This is her personal time to tell Jesus all the good and bad feelings. *I feel happy because... I feel afraid because...* These are personal and honest statements. Afterwards, she turns to supplication. She believes her asking should be done politely, just as you would if you asked your best buddy for something. She is being reverent before her God. Last, she asks Jesus what His will is for her in this new day. This means being quiet, listening for Jesus' answer, and then obeying Him. I think Kaela found the same secret that Joseph M. Scriven found when he wrote the lyrics to *What a Friend WE Have in Jesus*. I hope you know that secret, too.

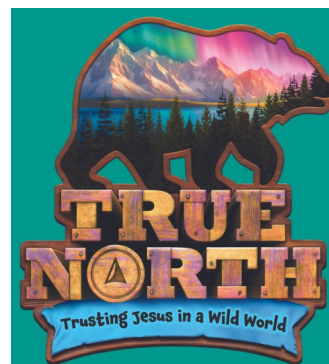

Required Minimum Distributions

To minimize your tax implications, and to directly benefit Brewster Baptist Church, you can request a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your plan's administrator. Any amount distributed to BBC from the IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (up to \$105,000) will not be taxed as ordinary income.
