# Prayer, Betrayal, Burial, and Resurrection in the Garden

Holy Week is April 13-20, and we'll have significant worship services throughout the week, from Palm Sunday through Easter. We hope you'll participate in as many as possible in person or online. Easter feels different when we've journeyed with Jesus through the events of that earth-shaking week. Throughout Holy Week, we'll also have a special display in the lobby to enhance our experience and you may read more about that in this edition of The

Beacon. In worship, we're continuing our series on "The Gardens of God," and it's notable that Jesus prays, is betrayed, buried, and raised in a garden.

We invite you to make this Holy Week a time of reflection, celebration, and connection. Holy Week is a season

that marks the final days of Jesus' life, His ultimate sacrifice, and the glorious victory of His resurrection. It's a time to gather, reflect, and grow in faith together.

We want to encourage you to go beyond attending the services and invite your friends, family, coworkers, and neighbors to join you in experiencing the love, hope, and renewal that Holy Week brings.

### Why Invite Others?

There's something uniquely powerful about Holy Week services. They provide a deep connection to the heart of our faith

as we walk through the events that shaped history — Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the Last Supper, His crucifixion, and His miraculous resurrection. These powerful moments not only invite us to remember what Jesus has done for us, but they also offer a chance for us to share that message of hope with others.

Many people are looking for a way to connect with God, or with a community of

believers, during this special time. Some may have experienced challenges, doubts, or loss, and Holy Week offers the opportunity to experience healing, encouragement, and renewal.

# FINANCIAL UPDATE

The first quarter of the year is almost done already. In February, Brewster Baptist Church passed a very ambitious budget with the addition of Pastor Nate Ryan. This is the first year BBC will carry his full salary and benefits. The good news is that BBC is off to a good start in our stewardship giving and total expenses are down, too!

The following numbers represent income and expenses through March 25, 2025. BBC has received \$381,382, which is \$25,000 more than last year at this time. Our budget is \$349,615. BBC is doing very well. Many people contributed their yearly Required Minimum Distribution, which has helped our overall numbers. Overall, BBC expenses were only \$340,000. This is below the budget of \$366,000.

Missions have always been a high priority at BBC, represented both in our annual budget and through our designated and special offerings. Currently, BBC has almost reached our goal of \$10,000 for the America For Christ Offering, as we have received \$9,800. This year, the Deacon Assistance Fund received \$18,391 in the first three months of the year! There was also \$10,000 gift for the Clemmers, who are missionaries working in Congo. Praise God!!! Thank you very much to everyone who contributed this year!

Overall, BBC is doing very well through the first twelve weeks of the year. If you would like to learn more about donating online or donating stock, please contact Pastor David Pranga or Treasurer, David Wilcock.


# THE CRUCIFIXION by artist JOHN BELFONTAINE

### Exhibition April 12-19, 2025 Church Hours

Approaching our 201<sup>st</sup> Easter as a church for the community in the heart of Cape Cod, we invite you to approach the celebration of Jesus' resurrection with reverence and wonder this Holy Week. Also known as Passion Week, this is a time when we reflect on Jesus' ultimate sacrifice, embrace his boundless love, and remember the "passion" of Jesus. During this time, we call to mind the pain and anguish that Jesus endured, the moments of final preparation, the awful suffering and ultimately, the crucifixion and death of our Lord.



"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him shall not perish but shall have eternal life." ~ John 3:16 As we meditate on the enormity of Jesus' sacrifice, we invite you to prepare your heart and mind by experiencing this artwork, created by artist John Belfontaine and biblical scholar Rev. Edwin Larson. May the God of the hills and the valleys shepherd your soul through these days, and may goodness, love, and mercy attend you all your days because of God's amazing grace.

**The Rev. Edwin H. Larson** is an ordained pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. His calling came in a developmental manner, beginning with him earning an Associate of Arts Degree from Luther College in Teaneck N. J. in 1968. After transferring to Gordon College in Wenham, MA, he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Biblical Studies in 1970. His interest in the Scriptures continued as he entered The Lutheran Seminary in Philadelphia, PA, where he received a Master of Divinity and was ordained into The Lutheran Church in 1974. These past 50 years, he has been called to be pastor to seven congregations — two in upstate NY, and five in western MA. He also grew to enjoy hospital ministry being granted the position as the first non-Catholic chaplain at Mercy Medical Center in Springfield and, during retirement, in 2017, as interfaith Chaplain at Cape Cod Hospital in Hyannis, MA. Presently, he serves through the Cape Cod Council of Churches, as interfaith Chaplain at Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital in East Sandwich, MA. He is married to his wife, Janet, of 54 years and resides in East Harwich, MA.

**John Belfontaine**, Artist, Illustrator, Designer, has been studying art, portraiture and the figure for 53 years. A self-taught photo-realist painter, his works have been exhibited extensively throughout New Hampshire, New York, Connecticut and Cape Cod. He has won numerous awards, including Best of Show and People's Choice. In 2003, John had an invitation to travel with The Big Apple Circus for the summer. The circus and circus life has always been a favorite subject to draw and paint providing portraiture and the movement of the figure. Belfontaine works in many mediums; oil, acrylic watercolor, charcoal, clay and wood. Among his favorite medium are etching and woodcut printing. John has illustrated books and designed posters, menus, signs, logos and architectural renderings. Retired from nursing in 2023, John has been pursuing projects that bring him back to his roots of drawing and painting. John and his wife, Karen, make their home in Centerville, MA.

### The Crucifixion

The Crucifixion of Jesus was the death of Jesus by being nailed to a cross. It occurred in the 1<sup>st</sup> century, in Judea, most likely in AD 30 or AD 33. It is described in the four canonical gospels, referred to in the New Testament epistles, and later attested to by other ancient sources. According to the canonical gospels, Jesus was arrested and tried by the Sanhedrin, and then sentenced by Pontius Pilate to be scourged, and finally crucified by the Romans. Jesus was stripped of his clothing and offered vinegar mixed with myrrh, or gall, to drink after saying "I am thirsty." At Golgotha, he was hung between two convicted thieves and, according to the Gospel of Mark, was crucified on the third hour (9:00 a.m.), and died by the ninth hour of the day (around 3:00 p.m.). During this time, the soldiers affixed a sign to the top of the cross stating, "Jesus of Nazareth, The King of the Jews", which, according to the Gospel of John, was written in three languages (Hebrew, Latin, and Greek).


Join us for the Easter Family Fun Event on Saturday, April 12 from 9:30-11:00 a.m.

At BBC, we wholeheartedly believe there is no age minimum to use your spiritual gifts for building up the body of Christ. As such, we have given our high school students the opportunity to take the same spiritual gifts course we offered to our adults during their Sunday




School hour throughout the month of March. Pastor David Pranga, with the help of Christy, have been leading our students through a spiritual gifts examination quiz, and sharing with them all the creative ways they can use their gifts to make BBC the best church it can be by using their newly-identified gifts.

In addition to this, our high school students are also participating in our all-church "Gardens of God" small group series on Sunday nights. For many of them, this is the first time they've ever been encouraged to journey through the story of God's redemption narrative in Scripture through the lens of a particular symbol or motif. Hopefully, by looking at all the gardens of the Bible and how they convey the important themes of creation, love, betrayal, and redemption, our students will be able to identify themselves within that story and understand, in a greater sense, the love God has for them – even in the midst of their own sin and mistakes.

Our middle school students have also begun the second part of a series entitled Faith Essentials. For the next six weeks, our middle schoolers will be diving into the gospels and learning more about who Jesus is, His teachings, and why He matters. In the Fall, part one of the series focused on the idea of faith. Now, we are encouraging them to take the next step of critically evaluating themselves and how they live, and ask, "Are you really trying to live like Jesus? What would that look like for you?"

On Friday, March 14, Sharon Kautz and Sarah LaFollette brought a large group of our students to Cape Cod Church for their annual Winter Jam all-Cape youth rally. Students from youth groups across the Cape came together for indoor and outdoor games, dinner, a time of worship, and a message from Pastor Johnny Paparo, Cape Cod Church's Youth Pastor.

March was an incredibly busy month for our spiritual formation core ministry, with our Wednesday and Friday Alpha offerings wrapping up, and our new Lenten "Gardens of God" series beginning. A major thank you to Tom Swaida and our Sextons, Ramzy and Nancy Asfour for their leadership and assistance, all those who contributed food, and for the members of our church staff who help facilitate meaningful discussions. We had over 50 individuals participate in our Alpha series, with many reporting they felt their faith both supported and challenged by the content of the videos and the question prompts asked at their tables. It was also a great opportunity to enjoy fellowship together and make new friends. We celebrate the fruit that God produced through our church's participation in Alpha and look forward to many more special discipleship and teaching opportunities such as this one in the future.

March also began the season of Lent and our all-church "Gardens of God" small group series. We currently have 15 small groups participating in this series, each committed to going deeper by discussing the Sunday sermons coinciding with each week together, while also reflecting on some rather serious topics, like the nature of sin and shame, good and evil, and the power of God's forgiveness. As the weather (hopefully) gets warmer around us, and the signs of new life blossom this spring, we anticipate the coming hope of Jesus' resurrection, which renders the powers of sin and death defeated, and reminds us that, no matter how lost or ashamed we may feel, there is an Almighty God whose power and love holds us. New life and redemption await those who call upon His name and respond to His invitation of love with gratitude and thanksgiving, and an eager will that says, "Yes, Lord. I'll obey."

Both the Cooks and the recipients of these meals are blessed. Nothing is more basic and important than


feeding someone in need, which is our way of helping to be the hands and feet of our Lord Jesus.


