Rooted in Faith: What Baptists Believe

As spring unfolds and new life emerges in our gardens and all around us, we're embarking on a nine-week worship series: *Rooted in Faith: What Baptists Believe.* In a world that's constantly changing, we seek a faith that's resilient, fruitful, and deeply anchored in the Lord.

A Faith That Triumphs Over Fear

Jeremiah 17:7-8 paints a vivid picture: "Blessed are those who trust in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD. They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit."

This passage reminds us that a faith rooted in God is not shaken by life's hardships. Instead, it remains steadfast, nourished by the living water of the Spirit. Wouldn't it be wonderful to have a faith that's unafraid, not anxious, but

resilient and fruitful? That's the kind of faith we're invited to cultivate — one that's deeply rooted in trust and grows stronger, even in adversity.


Bearing Good Fruit: The Evidence of Faith

Jesus taught, "In the same way, every good tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears bad fruit" (Matthew 7:17). The fruit of the Spirit — love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

gentleness, and self-control — are not just ideals; they are the natural outgrowth of a life connected to Christ (Galatians 5:22-23). Just as a tree draws life from its roots, we draw spiritual vitality from abiding in Jesus.

In John 15, Jesus describes Himself as the "true vine," and we are the branches. He says, "Apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Our ability to love, to serve, and to bear fruit comes not from our own strength, but from our connection to Christ. This abiding relationship is the heart of our faith and practice: we're called to remain in Christ, producing fruit that blesses others and glorifies God.

Rooted and Grounded in Love



In Ephesians 3:16-19, Paul prays for the church: "I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are

faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love..."Being "rooted and grounded in love" means that our foundation is the love of Christ — unshakable, immeasurable, and lifegiving. Our new life in Christ is marked by transformation — a change of heart that leads us to love God and others.


Theme: "Pour out to the God of hope and be filled." – Romans 15:13

We want to extend a heartfelt *thank you* to all those who took the time to participate in the 2025 BBC Engagement Survey. Your thoughtful responses, insights, and shared experiences have given us a clearer picture of our congregation and the wonderful ways we walk in faith together.

We received responses from 238 of you — a fantastic 39% response rate! The survey revealed that most of our respondents are long-term members from Brewster, Orleans, and neighboring Cape Cod towns, mostly aged 56–79. Yet, we also heard from younger members, families, seniors, and some of our part-time residents. Many of you attend in-person services weekly or 2–3 times a month and treasure the warm community, inspirational sermons, and joyful worship experiences. At the same time, our online attendees appreciate the flexibility and convenience of spiritual connection from home — a vital option for those facing health concerns, travel, or simply enjoying the extra accessibility.

We are delighted to learn that 97% of our in-person attendees and 87% of our online congregants report satisfaction with our worship services. Whether it's the uplifting music, meaningful sermons, or the spirit of fellowship you experience on Sunday mornings, it's clear that BBC continues to be a place of deep spiritual enrichment and belonging.

Beyond worship, many of you are engaging in service opportunities across our ministries — whether through mission teams, outreach initiatives like The Caring Cupboard and Faith Family Kitchen, small groups, the Holiday Fair, Bible studies, or family-oriented events. Your participation in these activities not only strengthens our community but also radiates Christ's love far beyond our church walls.

What stands out most is your shared appreciation for the core values that make BBC so special – a welcoming atmosphere and sense of belonging, a unified spirit of generosity, and a commitment to spiritual growth. You appreciate the personal and pastoral support, inclusiveness, and opportunities to serve that are felt realities in our day-to-day church life.




Saturday, May 3 at 5:00 p.m. – **Family Taco Night and Float Decorating Party!**
