collection of trusted friends, beloved mentors, and spiritual guides encouraging them with every deeper step they took in the water.

In our contemporary world, especially in the United States, there is a tendency to privatize our relationship with God, as if faith should strictly be understood as only a personal affair. I have heard many people say something to the effect of, "My faith shouldn't be of any concern to you" or "It's just between me and God," as if it's wrong for someone else to have a personal investment in whether or not you're faithfully following Jesus well.

Our faith is inherited. The knowledge of Jesus we have, and the eternal hope He offers, is contingent on not only sharing the story, but encouraging one another to live it. I'm grateful that we are a church that seems to understand this. We couldn't have had over two hundred people cheering us on yesterday any other way.

May all who come behind us find us faithful.
May the fire of our devotion light their way.
May the footprints that we leave lead them to believe
And the lives we live inspire them to obey.

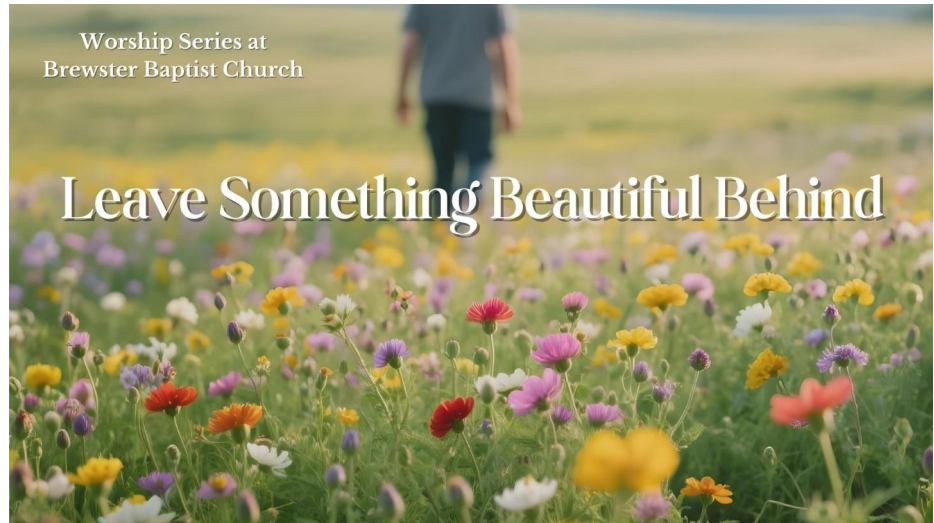

New Worship Series Starting August 31: Leave Something Beautiful Behind

In many Cape Cod homes and cottages, there are seashells, stones,

and sea glass that people have chosen to keep because of how beautiful they are. Every shell was once the home of a living creature that's left something beautiful behind, and that can inspire you to do the same. Are you living your life in such a way that, when you're gone, you'll leave something beautiful behind? If a snail can do it, you can, too!



On August 31, we started a new six-week series called **Leave Something Beautiful Behind**. Each week, we'll be looking at something we can do, a choice we can make, that can help us to create an enduring and beautiful legacy. These will include how we use the time we're given and taking time to rest and pray; using our spiritual gifts in service; being good stewards of creation, including the consumer choices we make, so that we leave a good earth to future generations; using technology wisely, as a tool, so it serves us and our relationships, rather than using it to our detriment; and managing our financial resources well, so we can live generously and support worthy projects, as close as Brewster and around the world, via our ABCUSA Global Servants and our missionary partners. Life is precious and fleeting, and we want to live it well, so when our time on earth is through, we will have left something beautiful behind us that is a blessing to others and honors God.

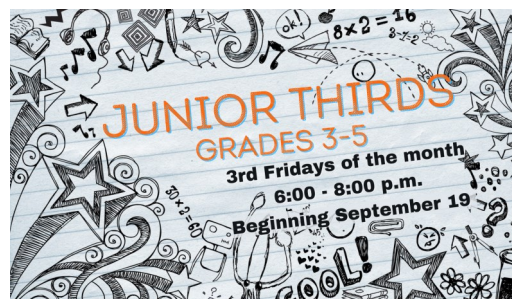

As the new school year approaches, we are PUMPED about all the fun happenings going on in our Student Ministry. Sunday School is about to kick off, our Sunday Youth Group nights will soon be in full swing, and we have a few VERY exciting special events on the horizon. Here is a schedule and short description of everything that's going on:

Friday, September 5, and Friday, September 19 — First and Thirds and Junior Thirds

Every first and third Friday of the month, from 7:00-10:00 p.m., we open up the youth area of our church for a fun evening of games and fellowship. We have a Wii, a pool table, a ping pong table, an air hockey table, a Pac-Man machine, and a bunch of fun outdoor activity options.

On the third Friday of the month (September 19), we also have a special offering called **Junior Thirds** for children in grades 3-5 to come and experience just a taste of what student ministry will be like, once they're old enough to participate! From 6:00—8:00 p.m., they can also come and participate in organized games and activities led by some of the high school students in our ministry.



Sunday, September 7 — Sunday School and The Amazing Race

We invite all students in grades 6-12 to join us as we kick off the new year of Sunday School with a fun party and games on the back field of the church parking lot. Our first official Sunday School classes, for both middle school and high school students, will begin on September 21. (Students will be volunteering for the Ministry Fair on September 14.)

Later that evening, from 5:00-8:00 p.m., we will hold our annual Amazing Race event. This is a staple — and crowd favorite — for all our students! All Middle School and High School students are welcome, and we'll assemble into teams and race across the Cape in a creative scavenger hunt, followed by pizza and soda in Fellowship Hall.



Tuesday, September 9 — Parents' Info Session

At 6:30 p.m., we invite all of our student ministry parents to come and learn about all our exciting student ministry events on the calendar, and our goals for the ministry this year. This is a time when parents can bring any questions they have, and learn about all the exciting ways we hope to help our students grow in their relationship with Jesus, in school year 2025-26.

Saturday, September 13 – AWAKEN Cape Cod

AWAKEN Cape Cod is a non-denominational revival event of hope, encouraging youth to pursue a future of faith in Jesus Christ. It will take place from 4:00-8:30 p.m., at Trinity Christian Academy in Barnstable. We are hoping to bring as many students as possible to this event! It will include a powerful message, a time of worship, a bunch of games, and food trucks.

Sunday, September 21 – Unpacking *The Anxious Generation* by Jonathan Haidt

Kylar Barr, renowned New England youth ministry leader, will be coming to BBC for a night to unpack Jonathan Haidt's best-selling book *The Anxious Generation* and what it means for today's youth. This is an event that we encourage both our high school students, and all parents of youth, to attend. This event will take place from 5:30-7:30 p.m., in the Sanctuary with an optional discussion to follow.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Summertime is almost over, and fall is approaching too fast. Brewster Baptist Church is entering the fall, financially, in an exceptionally outstanding position. Stewardship is up, and above budget. Expenses are below what we had budgeted for. Special Offerings and our Deacon Assistance Fund are quite healthy. All the numbers are current, as of August 30, 2025.

BBC Stewardship Income is running 10% greater than last year, and 6.5% over budget! Currently, BBC has received \$1,081,867, and we only budgeted \$1,010,00.00. To be above budget after eight months is fantastic news. Thank you so much to everyone for the generous support towards the mission of the church!

Overall, expenses are down in all five areas (payroll, operations, ministry, outreach, and missions) of our budget. BBC budgeted for \$1,057,334, but we have only spent \$938,509. The church is entering the fall season in an extraordinarily strong place. In previous years, we have spent the most money in the fourth quarter. Things are looking extremely positive for the second half of the year.

Earlier this month, we asked our church to replenish our Deacon Assistance Fund, as so far this year, BBC has given more assistance than we had received to date in 2025. Our BBC family has answered the call. BBC has received more than \$35,000 in the past month, bringing the total balance of the Deacon's Assistance Fund to \$64,567. This money will help many families and individuals who request assistance in the coming months. A special thank you to those who gave and made this possible.

Missions have always been a high priority at BBC, represented in both our annual budget and through our designated and special offerings. BBC has received \$17,420 for our One Great Hour of Sharing offering and \$14,015 for our America for Christ offering surpassing our goal of \$10,000 for each offering. BBC also received over \$32,000 for the "Feed My Starving Children" initiative. Praise God!!! Thank you very much to everyone who has contributed so far this year!

In 2025, there have been four capital projects at BBC. These include exterior renovations of \$8,909; a new projector screen and upgraded audio system in Fellowship Hall for \$3,705; front walkway for \$5,240; and repairs of the playground for \$18,411. The total of these four capital projects was \$36,265.

90-minute interactive sessions on the following topics to better equip us to care for the hurting people of our lives:

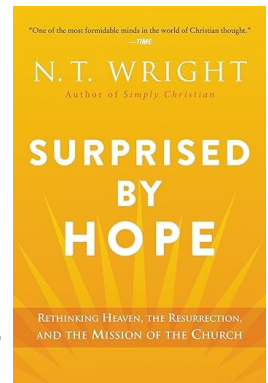
- Communication/Listening Skills

Financial Peace University – Thursdays from 7:00-8:30 p.m. starting October 2

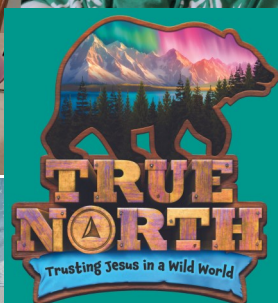

BBC's Wednesday Walks:




September 21 from 5:30—7:30 p.m.

Habitat for Humanity of Cape Cod partners with families in need of an affordable home to build one of their own, fostering stability, self-reliance, and a strong sense of community. Funds raised will help construct a home on Mackie Drive in Brewster.



Family Table Collaborative provides healthy, prepared meals to individuals and families in need on Cape Cod. Believing that healthy people create healthy communities, they address food security through access, distribution, and education initiatives.



Homeless Prevention Council (HPC) is a source of support and hope for Cape Cod residents, providing personalized guidance, practical tools, and compassionate care. HPC helps clients maintain housing, achieve financial independence, and build stable lives.

Honoring Two Pillars of Our Holiday Fair ***In Loving Memory of Earl Caudill and Bob Lindquist***

This year, as we gather for the 21st Annual Brewster Baptist Church Holiday Fair, we celebrate and remember two remarkable men who shaped our church and community. Earl Caudill and Bob Lindquist — beloved leaders, friends, and faithful servants — passed away earlier this year, leaving legacies that inspire us all.

A Legacy of Leadership and Faith Earl and Bob were more than just businessmen and active participants at BBC. They were men of deep faith and commitment, always lending their wisdom, encouragement, and energy to make the Holiday Fair — and many other church activities — a success.

Their efforts helped transform the Holiday Fair from its roots in the Women's Fellowship into the all-church event we celebrate today. What started as a small gathering grew into a joyful community tradition, thanks to their vision and tireless work.



Earl Caudill

Earl was a driving force behind the Fair's evolution. He supported the transition from a women-led event to one that encouraged broad

participation from across the church.

Along with Community Life and Fellowship Core Ministry leader Janet Bantly, Earl advocated that all Fair proceeds go to local non-profit organizations. In 2005, this dream began to take shape, as half the Fair's proceeds were given away. By 2007, every penny raised went out to help our neighbors!

Earl built lasting relationships with our local business community. He conceived and organized the annual businessperson's lunch, inviting local business owners and Town employees to BBC every November to thank them for their contributions. Earl personally handled invitations and made everyone feel welcome. And — always thinking ahead — he tied the lunch to the Holiday Fair by thanking local businesses for donating Auction items and making the Silent Auction one of the Fair's highlights.



Bob Lindquist

Bob was truly "Mr. Fair." Since he started volunteering in the early 2000s, there wasn't a job too big or too small for Bob. Whether it was

project planning, recruiting volunteers, helping with set-up, managing signage, or running the Coffee Shop — Bob did it all. If something needed doing, you could count on Bob to take care of it, always with a smile and an encouraging word. He was everywhere, keeping the Fair going and growing.

Bob played a vital role in expanding the Silent Auction, co-leading efforts to solicit donations and never taking "no" for an answer. Thanks to Bob's persistence and gift for salesmanship, the Auction has raised thousands of dollars for our community. When the original Steering Committee turned over in 2010, Bob stepped in as a leader and mentor to a new generation, always emphasizing that the Fair belonged to its volunteers — that its success was truly a team effort. Bob's devotion and enthusiasm made the Fair feel like a big family reunion each and every year.

A Shared Vision, A Lasting Impact Earl and Bob helped make the Holiday Fair what it is today — a joyful, generous community event that reaches far beyond our church. As we honor Earl Caudill and Bob Lindquist this year, let us remember to keep their outward focus, their faith, and their love for our community alive. Here's to two extraordinary men, whose lives remind us what a difference faithful service can make. Thank you, Earl and Bob, for showing us the way!
