THE HEART OF THE CHRISTIAN STORY

This year, April begins with the most sacred days of the Christian year. As spring unfolds, with longer days and signs of new life emerging around us, we are reminded of the deeper renewal that comes through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This month, our church family walks together through **Holy Week** and celebrates the glorious hope of **Easter morning**.

Holy Week is the heart of the Christian story. It begins with **Palm Sunday**, when Jesus entered Jerusalem to the shouts of "Hosanna!" The crowds waved palm branches and welcomed Him as king, yet within days, the same city would echo with cries of "Crucify Him." Palm Sunday reminds us how quickly praise can turn to rejection — and invites us to reflect on our own faith and commitment.

As the week continues, we remember **Maundy Thursday**, the night Jesus gathered with His disciples for the Last Supper. Around that table, He offered bread and wine, symbols of the new covenant of grace. He also washed the disciples' feet, showing that true leadership in God's kingdom is expressed through humility and service. It's a powerful reminder that we are called to serve others in Jesus' name.

Then comes **Good Friday**, the solemn day when we remember the crucifixion. At first glance, the cross appears to be a symbol of suffering and defeat. Yet, through the mystery of God's love, it becomes the very

place where forgiveness, redemption, and grace are made possible. The cross shows us the depth of God's love — a love willing to sacrifice for the sake of the world.

But the story does not end at the cross. On **Easter Sunday**, we gather in joy and celebration because the tomb is empty. The resurrection proclaims that sin does not have the final word, suffering is not the end of the story, and death itself has been defeated. Easter reminds us that hope is alive.

For Christians, the resurrection is more than a historical event — it is a living promise. Because Christ lives, we are invited into new

life today. Our fears, failures, and burdens do not define us. Instead, we're renewed by grace, and empowered to live with faith, courage, and love.

We invite you to walk the full journey with us. Come reflect during Holy Week. Come worship on Easter

morning. Come experience the story that has transformed lives for generations.

Whether you're a longtime member, a regular visitor, or someone exploring faith for the first time, there is a place for you at BBC. The message of Easter is for everyone: **hope is real, love is stronger than death, and new life is possible.**

May this season fill your heart with peace, renew your faith, and remind you of the incredible gift we celebrate together. **Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!**

Life has a way of shaking what we thought was secure. In the Letter to the Hebrews, we discover a hope strong enough to hold when everything else feels uncertain. This series will walk through Hebrews to show us Jesus Christ — our great High Priest, our perfect sacrifice, and our faithful forerunner — who anchors our souls in the presence of God. Along the way, we will hear both sober warnings and deep encouragements, calling us not to drift, shrink back, or grow weary, but to hold fast in faith. Through it all, Hebrews points us to the unchanging truth that our hope rests in Jesus Christ, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever.



The renowned SymphoNYChorus, under the direction of Henric Ideström, will present "An Evening with the SymphoNYChorus" at Brewster Baptist Church, on Saturday, April 11, beginning at 6:00 p.m., and Sunday, April 12, at 8:30 and 10:00 a.m. worship.

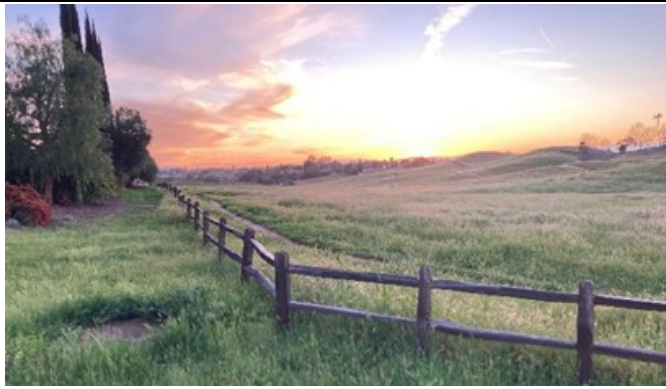


With 35 vocalists and a supporting orchestra of 15, the chorus was founded in 2008 by Ideström to showcase the diversity of inspirational religious choral music. Emphasizing passionate authenticity, Ideström is intent on demonstrating that "God's creation is not bland and nor should be our art." Citing his Swedish background, Ideström knows that not all musical tastes, much like foods, are the same; a *smörgåsbord* (offering a wide variety of styles) solves the problem. The chorus & orchestra presents two major concert series yearly, Christmas concerts and themed concerts in the spring.

The all-volunteer ensemble taps into the extraordinary wealth of musical talent in New York, eager to showcase skills and passion. Coming from as far as California, Wyoming, Arizona, and Texas – many in pursuit of Broadway breakthroughs – and others with diverse academic and professional backgrounds, the group is a mix of religious affiliations, ages, ethnic and racial profiles, and musical interests that carry over to their eclectic program compositions. The performers all have in common, under Ideström's leadership, musical excellence combined with expressive enthusiasm.

The SymphoNYChorus performs at venues throughout the New York tri-state region, including public stages, churches, synagogues, and corporate sites. The group has toured cities in the US, Canada, and UK, and recently issued its most recent recording, "Live in the United Kingdom", also available by streaming. “The Valley of Peace” by Joe Greemore, Pastor of Worship

Last month, I had the opportunity to fly to the picturesque Temecula Valley in Southern California for a time of retreat and renewal. Along with several ABCUSA ministry colleagues, we learned about the journey of ministry over the past year. We saw stunning sunsets and enjoyed the food, fellowship, and fresh air at our retreat center setting. Over three days, colleagues shared about experiences navigating current realities. Some drew comparisons between their experience of sabbatical and their ongoing ministry journey. Along with a dear friend, I shared pictures, stories, and lessons from my time on the *Camino de Santiago* in Northern Spain last year. The week in CA was soulful, renewing, and a refreshing 71 degrees-a-day, a nice rebound from the winter Nor'easter and bomb cyclone we just weathered in New England.

On the way back to the airport, following a wonderful week, I shared a pleasant drive with a friend as we caught up on life and ministry. After returning the rental car and busing to the terminal, I made my way inside for my 5:50 a.m. flight, where I was surprised to find a security line stretching through the upper floor, down the escalator, and across the ground floor, all the way to baggage claim. “Don’t panic,” I told myself inwardly, “I am trusting God to direct this circumstance for good.” It was altogether possible I would miss my boarding time due to the length of the line with my fellow travelers. I practiced deep breaths, thinking about the appointment I had made back on the Cape later that day. “If I miss my flight, I may miss my appointment.” Stress crept back in after a relaxing week of learning, sharing and growth.

After continued deep breaths and a “parting of the waters” when a group of children in the line moved to form their own security line, expediting the wait time by several minutes, I passed through security, gathered my belongings, and made a dash for the boarding area, just five minutes past the final boarding call. There, staff greeted me pleasantly, scanned my boarding pass, and directed me onto the plane. I found my seat and sat with a deep sigh of relief. The journey home had begun! I was right where I needed to be, when I needed to be there. The lessons from my time in Temecula and a too-close-for-comfort gate arrival continue to inspire and reassure me, giving me an abiding appreciation for all the little ways patience and peace can transform any situation.

As the generation who experienced these events grows older, preserving their memories and historical records becomes increasingly urgent. The exhibit tells the stories of Japanese Americans during the war years, and helps congregations like ours learn, reflect, and remember together. The exhibit will be arriving at BBC the week of April 6, and will be available for people to see, through Sunday, April 26. FINANCIAL UPDATE

BBC is almost three months (twelve weeks) into a new budget cycle. With the six Sundays of poor weather and snow, it is amazing to see that BBC is right on schedule with the budget in 2026. Praise God that things are going so well as we close the first quarter of the year. The numbers are through March 25, 2026.

Stewardship income is above budget and above last year's numbers! BBC has received \$286,200. Our budget was only \$280,000 – and last year at this time, we had received \$279,900. This is great news, especially since the first quarter of the year is the usually our lowest of the four quarters, as many of our snowbirds are away.

The expenses for 2026 are currently running on schedule. Currently, we have spent \$283,126 – less than we had budgeted, which was \$284,845 – through the first twelve weeks of the year. BBC has five categories for expenses. Operations and ministry budgets are exceeding their budget, which is typical during the first quarter. Payroll, communication and outreach, and missions are running below budget. This is typical, as well.

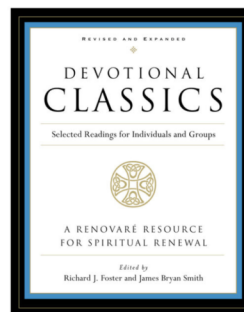
Special Offerings are important offerings received outside of our budget. As of March 25, BBC has received \$8,500 for the America For Christ offering; the goal is \$10,000. BBC has also received \$1,700 for the Caring Cupboard food pantry and \$5,035 for our Deacon Assistance Fund.

Released in 1939, one of the greatest years in the history of the movies, *Goodbye, Mr. Chips* is a deeply moving British drama, directed by Sam Wood and based on the novel by

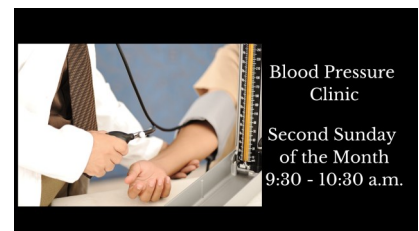


James Hilton. The film stars Robert Donat as the gentle and devoted schoolteacher, Mr. Chipping, alongside Greer Garson, in one of her earliest and most memorable roles. Set primarily within the walls of an English boys' boarding school (and filmed at Repton, a famous British school), the story quietly follows the life and career of a teacher whose influence reaches generations of students. Rather than relying on spectacle, the film reflects on memory, change, and the relationships that shape a life, and the impact one life can have. As you watch, notice how the passage of time, small personal moments, and the atmosphere of the school help reveal the character of Mr. Chips and the influence he has on those around him.

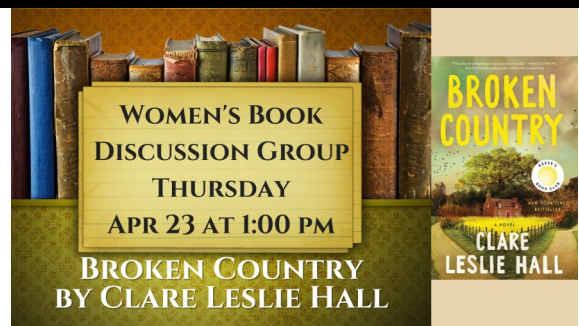
