Both Shelby and Joe have family in Kansas, and after serving faithfully in ministry in Colorado, Iowa, and Massachusetts, their families are surely looking forward to having them close by once again.

I believe God has prepared a place for Joe and Shelby where their gifts and skills can have a meaningful impact, and I'm confident the church in Stillwell will be blessed through their leadership.

There will be an opportunity for members and friends to share their gratitude and encouragement with Joe and Shelby after both worship services on June 7. Their final Sunday with us will be June 14 when we celebrate Children and Students' Sunday with one service at 10:00 a.m., followed by a church picnic.

I am thankful to Pastor Joe and the entire Greemore family for the ways they have served, loved, and invested themselves in the life of BBC over these last six years.

Their presence among us has been a true gift, and their faithfulness has left a lasting impact on our church community. We commend them to the grace of the Lord as they work through all the details that come with this transition – concluding one ministry and beginning a new one. I know God has good things in store for them.

Some people have asked me or other members of the staff, "What's next? Will we form a search team for another pastor?" At this point, the answer is, "No." Over the past few years, we have added Gwyneth Preu as our Family Ministry

Coordinator and Rev. Nate Ryan, who focuses on Discipleship with students and adults. Gwyneth and Nate are making a significant impact, and we are grateful for the ways they are serving.

In terms of worship, we are blessed to be able to call on Chris Morris to lead the Worship Team and our music program, a role he

held for nearly 20 years at BBC. Chris and I, along with the assistance of others, will work together to continue to make worship a time of inspiration and transformation. We have a terrific team of skilled volunteers who sing, play, and run our Media Booth on Sundays, serving with faithfulness, diligence, and joy.

Looking ahead, we may decide that it would be wise and beneficial to bolster our staff by adding a person part-time in worship and music. If we do, we will look for someone who has experience with both contemporary and traditional worship and who would work well with and complement Chris' talents and skills.

## FINANCIAL UPDATE

Summer is almost here, and with the warmer days comes a very active season of ministry at BBC. While many churches naturally slow down during the summer months, ministry at BBC continues in full swing through outreach events, missions, children and student activities, and opportunities for fellowship and discipleship. All of this is made possible through your faithful generosity and support. Thank you for the many ways you continue to invest in the ministry of our church.

As of May 20, 2026, stewardship giving has come in a bit below our projected budget. Our year-to-date budget target is \$633,846, and we have received \$598,046, which is approximately 94% of budget. While this places us about \$35,000 behind projections, we are grateful for the consistent faithfulness of our church family, and we are encouraged by the many ways God continues to provide.

The encouraging news is that expenses have also remained below budget. Year-to-date expenses are \$619,287 compared to a budgeted amount of \$643,077. Overall, BBC is currently operating at a deficit of approximately \$21,000. Operations and ministry expenses are slightly above budget, which is fairly typical during the first part of the year, while payroll, communications and outreach, and missions are all tracking slightly below budget.

One of the great strengths of BBC has always been a heart for missions and caring for others both locally and around the world. We are thankful for a generous \$25,000 gift designated to support the ministry of the Clemmers. In addition, our church family has already contributed more than \$25,000 toward Feed My Starving Children, with several weeks still remaining in the campaign. The Deacon Assistance Fund has received \$9,700, and the food pantry has received \$2,714. Earlier this year, BBC also gave \$12,400 toward the America for Christ Offering.

There is so much to be thankful for as we look at all God is doing through BBC. While stewardship giving is currently behind budget, we remain hopeful and encouraged as we head into the summer months. Thank you again for your continued faithfulness, generosity, and commitment to the ministry of BBC.

As we approach the summer season here on Cape Cod, many of our small groups and other spiritual formation initiatives take a pause in our church calendar. We encourage all of the members of our BBC community who have benefitted in some way by participating in our Spiritual Formation core ministry over the first half of the year to take this time to pause and reflect on all of the ways God has helped grow you to become more like Jesus so far in 2026. Among our small groups, Bible studies on Acts, Revelation, the life of David, and the lives of the 12 disciples were conducted, as well as our all-church small group series on the Mountains of God that took us through Lent and Holy Week. In addition, other small groups worked through John Mark Comer's popular "Practicing the Way" series, learning about what it looks like to learn from and follow our rabbi, Jesus, through the different spiritual practices that were central in his life; as well as others on developing healthy boundaries; and N.T. Wright's "Surprised by Hope".

And a major highlight of our ministry, this year, was our Devotional Classics series, which included reading weekly excerpts from some of the foremost spiritual writers in the history of the Christian faith, and taking time to reflect on and discuss some very poignant questions regarding the nature of discipleship and what it looks like to have an always deepening relationship with God in the everyday joys and struggles of life. We are humbled by, and deeply rejoice in, the fact that we had over 100 individuals participate in at least one of the first seven sessions of Devotional Classics that we offered in February and March. And enthusiasm for the class was so high that, by popular demand, we extended the series another seven weeks into April and May. Our plan is to continue the course, working through the book's next section on the Prayer-Filled Life of the believer, beginning the week of September 9 and 10. God is good! It is clear that people are growing in their faith here at BBC. There is a lot to celebrate and be grateful for this summer.

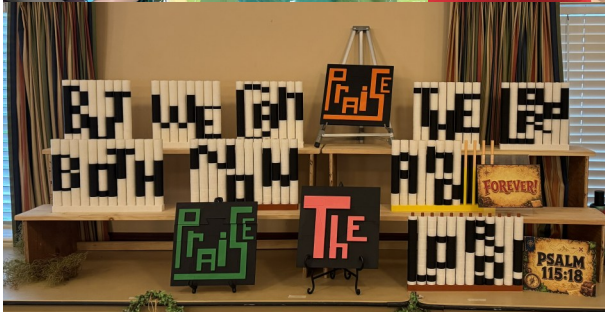

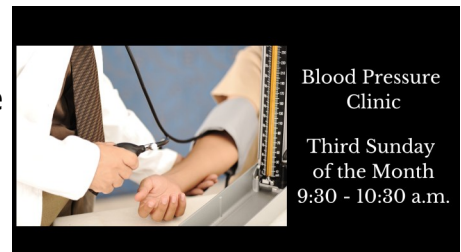

## Composting in the Meditation Garden

Creating quality compost doesn't happen overnight. It takes time and heat to transform rotting material into rich fertilizer that feeds the soil.
