A Freedom No Nation Can Give

Independence Day, especially this year on the 250th anniversary of the ratification of The Declaration of Independence, invites us to reflect on freedom. As Americans, we celebrate the birth of our nation and give thanks for the liberties we enjoy. In worship, as we continue our series, *Anchored in the Unchanging Christ, Hebrews 9* reminds us that there is a deeper freedom — one that no government can establish, no constitution can guarantee, and no nation can bestow.

The writer of Hebrews describes the worship practices of the old covenant, and then points us to Christ, our perfect High Priest. Unlike the repeated sacrifices offered year after year, Jesus entered the heavenly sanctuary "once for all" through His own blood, securing an eternal redemption for His people. Through His sacrifice, our consciences are cleansed, our sins are forgiven, and we are reconciled to God. This is a freedom far greater than political liberty. It's freedom from guilt, freedom from the power of sin, and freedom to live faithfully before God.

As we celebrate Independence Day, it's worth remembering that many of America's founders understood the importance of character and virtue in preserving liberty. The first president, George Washington, observed, "Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, religion and morality are indispensable supports." Washington recognized that external freedom depends upon internal character.

President John Adams expressed a similar conviction when he wrote, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly

inadequate to the government of any other." Adams understood that no system of government can compensate for a lack of virtue among its citizens or leaders.


President James Madison, often called the Father of the Constitution, also championed the sacred right of religious liberty. He wrote, "Conscience is the most sacred of all property." His words remind us that genuine faith cannot be compelled by governments or institutions. The freedom to worship God according to one's conscience is a precious gift that should be cherished and protected.

Yet even these important freedoms have limits. Nations rise and fall. Laws change. Constitutions can be amended. Earthly freedoms, valuable as they are, remain temporary. The freedom purchased by Christ is eternal. *Hebrews 9* teaches that Jesus has appeared "once for all at the end of the ages to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself." Because of Christ's faithfulness, believers have a hope that extends beyond the fortunes of any earthly kingdom.

As we gather with family and friends this July, let's give thanks for the blessings of our nation, and pray for wisdom, character, and faithfulness among its people and leaders. Let's also celebrate the greater freedom found in Jesus Christ. Through His sacrifice, we have received what no nation can give and no earthly power can take away: forgiveness, peace with God, and the promise of eternal life.

May we live as grateful citizens of our country — and even more importantly, as faithful citizens of God's kingdom.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

As we move into the summer months, I want to say thank you to everyone who faithfully supports the ministry of Brewster Baptist Church through your stewardship giving. Your generosity makes it possible for BBC to continue serving, discipling, and reaching others in the name of Jesus Christ. Ministry does not slow down at BBC during the summer. Outreach events, missions, children's and student ministries, fellowship opportunities, and discipleship continue in full swing, and your faithful support helps make all of that possible.

Over the past few months, stewardship giving has not always kept pace with expenses, but we are grateful that, in recent weeks, giving has strengthened and our financial outlook for the summer is encouraging. As of June 25, 2026, our year-to-date stewardship budget target is \$792,308, and we have received \$766,860, which is 96.7% of budget. While we are currently \$25,448 behind projections, we remain thankful for the steady faithfulness of our church family and are encouraged by the many ways God continues to provide for BBC.

The good news is that expenses have also remained below budget. Year-to-date expenses are \$745,952 compared to a budgeted amount of \$803,846, which means BBC is currently operating \$57,894 below budget. Overall, the church is ahead by \$20,908 for the year. Operations and ministry expenses are slightly ahead of budget, which is fairly typical during the first half of the year, while payroll, communications and outreach, and missions are all tracking below budget.

One of the things I appreciate most about BBC is the heart our church has for missions and caring for others, both locally, regionally, and around the world. That heart has been evident again this year. BBC raised over \$32,000 for Feed My Starving Children, and through the MobilePack event, 108,864 meals were packed for hungry children around the world. In addition, the Deacon Assistance Fund has received \$14,874, and the food pantry has received \$2,794. In July, we will also have the opportunity to support One Great Hour of Sharing, which extends compassion and care to people in need in both the U.S. and around the world. The mission goal is \$10,000.

There is much to thank God for as we look at all He is doing through Brewster Baptist Church. Thank you again for your continued faithfulness, generosity, and commitment to the ministry of BBC. The **One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS)** offering that we receive, beginning on Sunday, July 5, helps to provide relief to those suffering because of natural disasters or heartache caused by human behavior. Imagine what it would be like if you had to stand in line to receive a small amount of food to feed your whole household. The OGHS helps by delivering first-aid supplies, medication, and vitamins, all over the world – think about how life might be different for you, or for someone you love, to be without ready access to medical care and prescriptions. When mudslides and severe storms ruin crops, our gifts help to plant trees, start fish farms, and rebuild homes. **Our goal for this offering is \$10,000.**

Feed My Starving Children Cape Cod MobilePack™

The second Cape Cod MobilePack™ was held on May 29-30, 2026, at Trinity Christian Academy in Hyannis. Over 500 volunteers packed 108,864 meals for hungry children.

These meals were sent to a mission partner, Children's Cup, in Eswatini, Africa, where they will be distributed to students at a CarePoint. A CarePoint is a safe place where children find more than meals and medical care — they find connection, belonging, and the confidence to dream. It's where physical needs are met, relationships are built, and lives begin to change from the inside out.

How did we do it? With God's help at every step of the unlikely journey!



In 2024, a Brewster Baptist Church (BBC) member introduced the Missions and Outreach Team to the Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) organization. Starting in 1987, from one small site in Brooklyn Park, Minnesota, FMSC has grown now to eight sites in four different states (Minnesota, Illinois, Arizona, and Texas). These sites pack six days a week, five sessions a day. While permanent site buildings can only fit so many people, MobilePack™ events can expand those walls and go to communities across the nation. In 2026, FMSC surpassed over 5 BILLION meals packed.

The Missions and Outreach Team was interested in researching the opportunity. While the BBC Holiday Fair focused on local needs, a MobilePack™ would help our global "neighbors." The Missions and Outreach Team wisely advised that we work with other churches in the THRIVE network, thus tapping into more volunteers and donors and sharing the benefits and risks of hosting. A Leadership Team was put together with several churches represented. Pastor Doug Scalise reached out to Trinity Christian Academy (TCA). Holding the event there would provide a central Cape location in Barnstable, allow TCA students to fully participate, and bring hundreds of volunteers – and potential future students and supporters — onto the campus. BBC member Su Ballantine, in her role as Board of Trustee Chair, facilitated the collaboration.



In May 2025, we held the first Cape Cod MobilePack™. We faced many challenges, including a doorway that was too narrow for a pallet to pass through! Also, the entire Leadership Team and all the volunteers (with only a handful of exceptions) were rookies. Despite those challenges, over 107,000 meals were sent to mission partners in El Salvador and Liberia and volunteers who packed were fed in spirit.

May 28-30, over 500 volunteers came together

to pack 108,864 meals!!

Thank you for your prayers, donations, and time!



Over the following months, we discussed if we should do another MobilePack™. We would need to find a solution to the “Door Problem” and encourage our network to take a larger role. With God’s help, TCA and our church group put in a wider door at the site, we added to our Leadership Team, and several churches joined the network. We committed to hosting in May of 2026.

The 2026 event was a success! Many of our volunteers were repeat packers and were very efficient! As we close the books on the second MobilePack™, we want to thank BBC for the incredible support. Whether through prayer, packing meals, inviting others, or donating, you answered God’s clear instruction to feed the hungry. Thank you for showing God’s love through action by feeding our brothers and sisters in Eswatini.

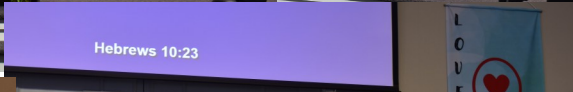

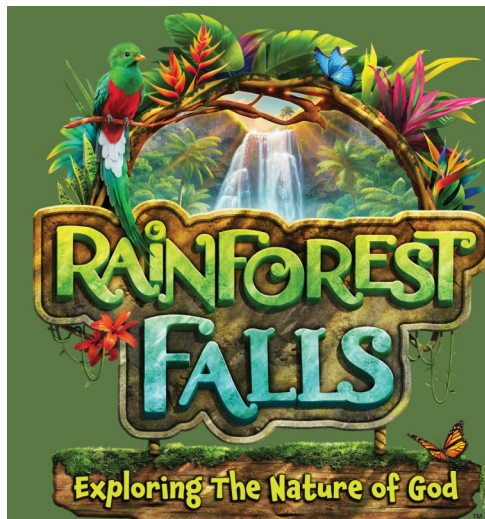
We are so excited to welcome children from the community to our church to learn about God’s love and grow their faith!
